Action Plan - Purpose

HUD requires an Annual Action Plan that allocates formula grants for the upcoming fiscal year to serve needs in the areas of:

- Affordable Housing,
- Homelessness,
- Public Services,
- Economic Development, and
- Community Development

Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG)

- Primary Goals
 - Provision of decent housing
 - Creation of a suitable living environment
 - Expanding economic opportunities
- National Objectives
 - Benefit low and moderate income persons (<80% AMI:\$77,900 for family of four)
 - Prevent or eliminate slums or blight
 - Meet a community need of particular urgency
- Federal Spending Requirements
 - No more than 1.5X current County grant by August 2nd

CDBG Eligible Activities

- Public Services
- Public Facilities and Infrastructure
- Economic Development
- Demolition and Clearance
- Code Enforcement

Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)

- Objective:
 - Provide housing and supportive services to homeless and atrisk very-low income populations (<30% AMI: \$30,000 for family of four)
- Eligible Activities
 - Emergency Shelter
 - Homeless Prevention
 - Rapid Re-housing
 - Transitional Housing
 - Client Management Information System

HOME Investment Partnership (HOME)

- Objective
 - Provide decent affordable housing to very-low and low income households (<80% AMI: \$77,900 for family of four)
- Eligible Activities
 - Homebuyer Assistance
 - New Construction
 - Acquisition and/or Rehabilitation
 - Rental Assistance
 - Community Housing Development Organizations (Mandatory 15% of HOME allocation)

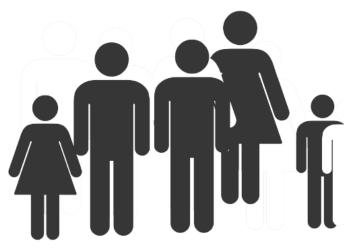

Housing Assistance

- Financing to 26 first-time homebuyers
- Rehabilitation of 305 owner-occupied homes
- Provided foreclosure prevention to 72 households
- Construction of 181 affordable rental housing units
- Direct rental assistance to 820 very-low income families

Homeless Services and Prevention

- Served 2,291 homeless persons through the Senator Philip Lewis Center, Salvation Army, YWCA, etc.
- Re-housed 820 persons who were homeless or at risk of homelessness through ESG, HOME, CARES and ERA funds

Public Services Accomplishments

- Partnered with 11 not-for-profit agencies and PBC Community Services Department
- Expended \$966,617 CDBG
- Benefited 3,102 persons

Special Needs Services

- Served 796 persons with special needs, including persons with physical, mental, and developmental disabilities, victims of domestic abuse, teens aging out of foster care, veterans, and elderly.
- Case management and counseling, life skills training, vocational habilitation, emergency meal delivery, home accessibility retrofitting.

Public Facilities & Infrastructure

- Constructed 8 capital improvement projects
- Expended \$749,403 of CDBG funds
- Benefitted 59,855 people

- HED and two (2) economic development partners provided financial services and technical assistance to businesses to create/retain jobs

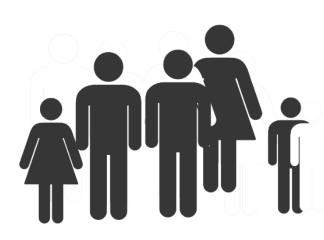
Code Enforcement



- CDBG \$442,021 to the Cities of Belle Glade, Pahokee, Mangonia Park, Riviera Beach and South Bay to conduct code enforcement.
- Dangerous buildings, unpermitted structures, public nuisances, overgrown lots, abandoned vehicles, etc.
- Benefitted 39,965 residents of the five municipalities.

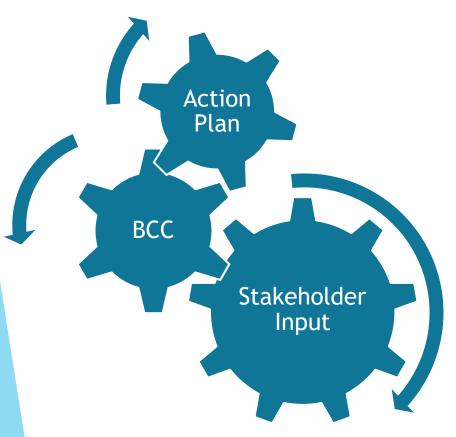
