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- 1. Call to order/roll call Daniel Gibson opened the meeting. Attendees introduced themselves. Agency roll call was taken to establish a quorum.
- 2. Approve minutes from previous meeting Minutes from the April 26 meeting were unanimously received.
- 3. Universal Application and Universal Assessment Georgiana Devine reported that HUD requires that the data from the Universal Application to be entered in CMIS. Some edits were suggested and will be analyzed. Georgiana will e-mail the protocol for the Self Sufficiency Matrix. Call Georgiana if you want training or if you want descriptions for the data fields.
- 4. Amendment to By-Laws Georgiana Devine reported that the Executive Committee approved adding the Chair of the HMIS Oversight Committee to the Executive Committee. A motion was made to amend article 5, section 1, of the by-laws, to increase the maximum number of Executive Committee Members to ten so that the HMIS Oversight Committee Chair can be included as a member of the Executive Committee. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.
- 5. Palm Beach County Counts Greta Van Unruh postponed until July.
- 6. Citizens for Improved Transit Tomas Boiton reported that Citizens For Improved Transit is a community of citizens in south Florida united by the common goal of achieving more accessible, affordable public transportation. - b. Discharge Planning –Kim Parnett reported on behalf of Michele Carter that a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) for jails is in progress. A MOA for Prisons will be next.
- c. Performance Measures Daniel Gibson reported that the committee is working with 211 to establish a collection and reporting procedure for Performance Measures. A discussion will be held in the future about how performance measures will be used. There was a question on the definition of program completion. There will be an overview at a CoC meeting.
- d. New Members Rhonda Clinton reported that the New Member Packet has been presented at the Exec Committee Meeting. The Packet will be e-mailed to the Exec Committee and then presented to the CoC.
- e. Unmet Needs Kathleen Herd reported that the survey was presented to the Executive Committee Meeting in April. The revised survey will be distributed at the July meeting.
- f. Housing Inventory Chart Wendy Tippett no report. The committee needs members.
- 8. Liaison Reports Homeless Coalition/HAB and Housing Resource Center Marilyn Munoz gave the following report:
 - a. The Homeless Advisory Board met on May 16th. Discussion centered on the types of reports they will be receiving regarding the operation of the Lewis Center. The next meeting will be August 15th from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.
 - b. The Senator Philip D. Lewis Center will be opening on July 2, 2012. A director has been hired, Ezra Krieg. Ezra brings experience in operating a homeless center, working with a food bank and is one of the original Homeless Advisory Board members. The clinical director hired is Carol Schaffer who also brings a world of experience having worked both in Human Services and the Jerome Golden Center. The County will be holding a ribbon cutting on Monday, June 25th. The Homeless Coalition will be hosting an open house and light refreshments from 8:30 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. at the Center on the same day.
 - c. Everyone is invited to participate on the committees of both the HAB and the Homeless Coalition. The Housing Committee meets the 2nd Thursday of each month from 3:30 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. The next meeting is June 14th. The committee is concentrating on back end housing needs. The Policy and Legislative Committee will be concentrating on establishing a dedicated funding stream. If you are interested in working on that committee please contact Marilyn Munoz.
 - d. If HHA members are planning activities for the Hunger and Homeless Awareness Week please let the Coalition know so they can start a calendar of events for that month. The calendar will be distributed so partners can supports each other's events.
