DPC and Tri-Rail Team Up to Promote Water Safety

Drowning incidents occur year-round in Palm Beach County, so there is a need to continuously provide water safety messages to the public. The Drowning Prevention Coalition (DPC) of Palm Beach County and the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority/Tri-Rail has formed a partnership to disseminate drowning prevention information.

Tri-Rail has donated the use of five advertising spaces inside its trains for displaying colorful posters that will be viewed by thousands of passengers. The posters portray the coalition's mascot, Buddy the seahorse, along with the ABCDs of water safety.





The DPC suggests that everyone uses the ABCDs of water safety to stay safe in and around water, but it is up to each individual to make sure a drowning incident does not occur.

Rotary Club of Delray Beach Donates \$1,000 for Josh the Baby Otter Materials

Josh The Baby Otter was created in honor of Joshua Collingsworth, a 2 ½ year old boy who lost his life to a drowning accident in June of 2008. He got out of his parents sight during a family gathering and ended up in the pool. This book was created by the Collingsworth family to teach children that water is fun but only with an adult. With the \$1,000 donated by the Rotary Club of Delray Beach, the following materials were given to the DPC: one oversized Josh The Baby Otter book (to be kept for our educational programming), and 243 smaller Josh The Baby Otter books (with powerpoint/audio presentation disc) with subsequent coloring pages to be delivered to children in Delray Beach.
