New Look But Same Message

Part of organizational growth requires the ability to evolve. In an effort to enhance the Coalition's presence in Palm Beach County, a rebranding of sorts has taken place. With assistance from Palm Beach County Graphics, the Coalition has implemented a new logo that embodies the essence of the DPC – to prevent drowning by lending a helping hand to the community through free water safety educational programming for audiences of all ages, offer monetary support for swim lessons, and disseminate life saving drowning prevention materials.



The Coalition partnered with 10 Leadership Palm Beach County participants to develop a DPC mascot that would bring added public attention to not only the organization itself, but the importance of water safety. The DPC mascot was actually chosen by the public at the 2014 South Florida Fair. More than 2,500 attendees of all ages voted on which mascot they liked best, a manatee or seahorse. The manatee received a lot of votes for its Florida roots, but the seahorse attracted the eyes and enthusiasm of the younger voters. We are proud to introduce Buddy...

Head Start Children Benefit From Free Water Safety Swim Lessons



According to Safe Kids Worldwide, "Drowning is the leading cause of injury-related death among children between 1 and 4 years old. And it's the third leading cause of death among children." Based on this information, the DPC proactively approached and partnered with John Denson Pool in Boynton Beach to provide 73 Head Start children ages 4 and 5 eight water safety swim lessons. Head Start promotes school readiness for low-income children by enhancing their cognitive, social and emotional development through various learning environments. The Coalition hopes to continue this partnership in the years to come.
















Crash, Splash & Escape

The Drowning Prevention Coalition received a Distinguished Service Award for Education from the Traffic Safety Committee of the Palm Beaches for its outstanding community contribution in providing information to audiences of all ages on how to escape a sinking vehicle.









The nation's top water safety and training organizations joined forces to present The World's Largest Swimming Lesson (WLSL) on Friday, June 20, 2014, to build awareness of the vital importance of teaching children to swim. Waterparks, pools and other aquatic facilities around the globe hosted local swimming lessons simultaneously at 11 a.m. Eastern Standard time in an attempt to break the Guinness World Record.

The DPC participated in the WLSL at two different locations. A display table as well as a visit from Buddy took place at Pompey Park Pool in Delray Beach. There were more than 186 participants. The DPC was also represented on the same day at Small Fish Big Fish swim school in West Palm Beach where water safety information was distributed to the adult attendees.



Our Kids World Family Fun Fest was held this April and August at the South Florida Fairgrounds. Geared towards children 12 and under, there were hands-on activities, educational display booths, sports mascots, television characters, bounce houses and entertainment. The DPC was invited to participate in the event so Buddy, DPC staff, and some of the amazing volunteers got to hand out water safety information to Fun Fest participants.

On Memorial Day 2014, the Coalition partnered with the Palm Beach County Sheriff Office's Marine Unit, U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary, Palm Beach County Fire Rescue Reserve Battalion, Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission and other organizations to support the "Think Before You Sink" sober boating campaign. The DPC's role was to set up a water/boating educational display booth at Phil Foster Park in Riviera Beach. The initiative is to encourage designating a boat captain who remains sober during outings. Boaters register for a vessel inspection and learn boating safety tips. Each registrant receives a wrist band that provides discounts to local restaurants and free non-alcoholic beverages for boat captains. The "Think Before You Sink" campaign also takes place on the July 4th and Labor Day weekends. If boaters participate in all three events, they'll be entered into the running for the grand prize – a Bahamas cruise on board the Celebration.
