Week Recap

The legislature held its final committee week to hear bills and appropriations leading up to the 2018 legislative session, which begins on January 9. Delegation members and staff were busy last week in committees presenting legislation, appropriations, and policy priorities for the upcoming Session.

Bills and Policy

The House Select Committee on Hurricane Response and Preparedness met on Monday to review policy recommendations submitted to the committee for legislative consideration. Committee member Rep. Michael Grant on behalf of Rep. Rick Roth submitted two recommendations. The first recommendation would exempt from sales tax the purchase of any equipment that uses natural or petroleum gas to generate emergency electric energy at nursing homes and assisted living facilities. The second recommendation would exempt from the sales tax the purchase of generators used on farms.

HB 517 - State Employees' Prescription Drug Program by Rep. MaryLynn Magar was heard in the House Health and Human Services committee on Tuesday. The bill requires the Department of Management Services to implement formulary management cost-saving measures and removes provisions that prohibit the department from implementing restricted prescription drug formulary or prior authorization program in state employees' prescription drug program. The bill passed favorably out of committee and is now in House Appropriations committee.

Wednesday, the House Criminal Justice subcommittee heard HB 491 - Theft by Rep. Rick Roth, which extends the mandatory \$10,000 fine to theft of commercially farmed animals or bee colonies of a registered beekeeper. The bill was reported favorably and is now in House Judiciary committee.

HB 421 - Homestead Waivers by Rep. Lori Berman provides language that that may be included in a deed that creates a presumption that the spouse knowingly and intelligently waived his or her right to inherit such homestead property. The bill passed favorably out of the House Civil Justice & Claims subcommittee on Thursday and is now in House Agriculture & Property Rights subcommittee

The House Children, Families & Seniors Subcommittee passed out of committee, HB 721 - Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services by Rep. David Silvers Thursday. The bill requires county jails to continue to administer psychotropic medications as were prescribed at mental health treatment facilities upon a facility client's discharge. The bill also requires county jails to send all medical information for individuals in their custody who will be admitted to state mental health treatment facilities. The bill is now in House Health Care Appropriations subcommittee.

Local Bills

Two local bills, sponsored by Rep. Matt Willhite, were filed this week. The first, HB 889 - West Palm Beach Police Pension Fund revises retirement pension calculations for the City of West Palm Beach police department and corrects scrivener's errors. HB 901 - Acme Improvement District and Pine Tree Water Control District transfers land from Acme Improvement District to Pine Tree Water Control District. Both local bills have been referred to the House Local, Federal, & Veterans Affairs subcommittee.

Member Highlights

Sen. Bobby Powell held a press conference on Tuesday to discuss his legislation, SB 936 - Juvenile Justice. The bill aims to reduce the number of children who are direct filed and prosecuted as adults. SB 936 would create a fitness hearing where a child could request the judge send the case back to juvenile court. Additionally, it would prevent youth prosecuted as adults from losing their future civil rights and eliminates direct file for 14-and 15-year-olds altogether.

On Thursday, Rep. Lori Berman had a joint press conference announcing her resolution for Medicaid Expansion under the Affordable Care Act in Florida. Rep. Berman's resolution HJR 911 - Expansion of Medicaid Coverage proposes an amendment to State Constitution to expand Medicaid coverage to include persons under age 65 with income equal to or below 138 percent of federal poverty level. If passed the proposed amendment would come before the voters.

Appropriations

Last week a number of committees heard House appropriations project bills.

Wednesday, the House Agriculture and Natural Resources Appropriations subcommittee heard member's water and environmental appropriations project bills. All the bills passed favorably out of the committee including these delegation sponsored projects:
