EBO PROGRAM ORDINANCE



Small businesses wishing to participate in Palm Beach County's contracting opportunities in the areas of Commodities, Construction, and Professional Services may apply for small business certification. Certification is granted for up to three (3) years, except in accordance with the graduation and suspension provision found in the EBO Ordinance (Sec. 2-80.21). Palm Beach County utilizes the National Institute of Government Procurement (NIGP) commodity codes to classify vendors according to the services and products they provide.



CERTIFICATION ELIGIBILITY

Palm Beach County
Board of County Commissioners

- Your business <u>must</u> be registered with the State of Florida (<u>www.sunbiz.org</u>) as a "FOR-PROFIT" business, and domiciled in Palm Beach County.
- Your business <u>must</u> have a PALM BEACH COUNTY Business Tax Receipt.
- Your business <u>must</u> have a "Significant Business Presence" in Palm Beach County.
- Your business <u>must</u> be independently owned and operated.
- Minority and/or Women owned businesses <u>must</u> be at least 51% owned, managed, and controlled by one or more minority group and/or woman, that is ready, willing, and able to provide the goods and/or services to PBC



CERTIFICATION ELIGIBILITY



Your business and any subsidiaries or affiliates must <u>meet the size standard</u> for small S/M/WBEs based on gross receipts averaged over a three (3) year period and must not exceed the following categories:

• \$13 Million

CCNA-Professional

• \$7 Million



• \$5.7 Million Goods
• \$7 Million

• \$5.7 Million

*Normal process can take up to 90-business days. Expedited reviews, after initial review and manager's approval can take up to 20-business days.

BECOMING A VENDOR

Palm Beach County's ("County") Vendor Self Service ("VSS") System provides New and Existing Vendors with access to County solicitations for all goods and services. VSS is updated on a daily basis to provide you with current information regarding County solicitations, vendor registration information and vendor payment/status




All existing vendors MUST activate their vendor information/account in VSS including their email address and commodity codes, in order to receive notifications of solicitations when advertised and to check payment status.



VENDOR REGISTRATION

Registering as a vendor with Palm Beach County is an online process managed by our Purchasing Department. The public may register through the Vendor Self-Service System (VSS) at https://pbcvssp.pbc.gov/vssprd/Advantage4.





Register a new vendor account, or find and activate your existing vendor account already on file.

Once you complete the registration process, you'll enjoy having immediate access to your account information, and being notified of our latest business opportunities. Start the process now by signing up as a user



WHAT IS A COMMODITY CODE?




A commodity code is a standard system of numbers that are used to identify the goods and services that are being purchased.

Palm Beach County uses NIGP codes.



91428	Cleaning, Interior/Exterior, New Construction
96221	Cleaning Services, Steam and Pressure

PAPER APPLICATION PROCESS

A paper version of the application is also available however, they must be mailed or delivered to the Office of Equal Business Opportunity. Emailed versions are not accepted.

Applications are available on the website and found on the Programs Tab.



DOCUMENTS NEEDED

Zoning and Location

- Proof of Business Registration (Sunbiz, Department of State)
- Business Tax Receipt (Palm Beach County and Municipality)
- Current Executed Lease Agreement or Proposed Property Tax Bill
- Master Lease Agreement (fully executed), if subletting

Financials and Investors

- Federal Tax Returns (3 most recent years) with all attachments
- Schedule C for Sole Proprietors filing 1040 IRS forms
- □ 1065 IRS Forms for Partnerships
- Balance Sheet/Income Statement (for businesses less than one year)-For all months in business
- Proof of Capital Investment (including all investors and agreements)

DOCUMENTS NEEDED

Operations and Services

- ALL State and County professional licenses and certificates applicable for your industry
- Copies of Resume (professional services), Owners and Directors only
- Largest Contract to date
- Invoices and Contracts for every commodity code indicated in registration
- By Laws, Stock Shares, Certificates, and Holders, Operating Agreement, Ledgers, Board Members, etc.

Employees and Equipment

- Current list of ALL employees (date of hire, position/title, Full/Part time)
- Current Reemployment tax form (RT-6 or tax form 941)
- Copies of 1099 for independent contractors
- Equipment list (if applicable)
- Insurance, Bonding, Worker's Comp., etc.

DOCUMENTATION NEEDED FOR MINORITY AND WOMEN BUSINESS ENTERPRISES

Palm Beach County
Board of County Commissioners

- Proof of gender and/or ethnicity
- Examples of documents that can be used to provide proof of race, gender, and/or ethnicity are:
 - Driver's License
 - Birth Certificate









All certified S/M/WBEs are listed in OEBO's online directory that is updated daily for maximum exposure.

CERTIFICATION BENEFITS

Other local government agencies accept PBC certification to achieve vendor diversity.

Affirmative Procurement Initiative (API) plan designed to encourage equitable utilization and greater participation of certified S/M/WBE businesses.

MARKET YOUR CERTIFICATION

- > Attend Mandatory New SBE Orientation Training.
- > Palm Beach County's Library Small Business Resources.
- > Participate in outreach activities of local agencies.
- Always check your email for notifications from PBC Purchasing for RFQs, IFBs and RFPs, informing you of bid opportunities on the PBC Purchasing website. Also, check the PBC Business Opportunities link for all solicitations. This also on the OEBO website.







MARKETING YOUR CERTIFICATION

- > You can also use OEBO's website to locate other S/M/WBE's by clicking on the Vendor Directory tab.
- Use the internet to check other websites of local, state, and federal agencies for opportunities.
- Attend tradeshows such as Business Matchmaker, join local Chambers to network and market your business, and pass out your business cards.
- Schedule a one-on-one session with an OEBO Specialist to better understand the bidding process, including terms and conditions.
