ZONING RESOLUTION #3-B-64

MODIFYING GENERAL PROVISIONS AS THEY APPLY TO COMMERCIAL SETBACKS AND SWIMMING POOLS

ADOPTED MARCH 5, 1964

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ZONING COMMISSION OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLOR-IDA, in regular session assembled this the 5th day of March, A. D. 1964, that the following modifications are hereby adopted as an Amendment to Zoning Resolution #3 pursuant to the authority vested in said Commission by Chapter 59-1686, Special Laws of Florida 1959:

Under <u>Section 2 - DEFINITIONS</u> add the following after the definition of STRUCTURAL ALTERATIONS:

SWIMMING POOL. A structure above or below ground level used for bathing or wading purposes and being over eighteen inches (18") deep and with a surface area of more than forty (40) square feet.

Under <u>Section 14 - GENERAL PROVISIONS AND EXCEPTIONS</u> delete 9(e) and (f) as written and substitute the following:

- (e) Front yards for all commercial buildings, except those governed by Section 14-9-(d) above, shall be determined by the building setback lines as follows:
 - Where there is sixty feet (60') or more of right-of-way, there will be a minimum setback of twenty feet
 (20') from either the ultimate or existing right-of-way line whichever is greater.
 - When there is less than sixty feet (60°) of right-ofway, there will be a minimum setback of fifty feet (50°) from the centerline of all streets.
- (f) No side yard shall be required for commercial buildings,except on a street side yard, in which case, Section 14-9-(d) and Section 14-9-(e) shall apply.

Under <u>Section 14 - GENERAL PROVISIONS AND EXCEPTIONS</u> after 18 New and Second Hand Boat, and Trailer Sales Lots - add:

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19. Swimming Pools

Yard Requirements:

All swimming pools will meet the yard requirements for that district in which they are located.

For purposes of measuring setback requirements, a perimeter of three feet will be established surrounding any swimming pool and considered a part of such pool. All measurements will be taken from this perimeter.
