Description:

This interactive training is for intermediate level clinicians and service providers. The presentation will offer comprehensive approach to understanding poverty. Participants will review poverty research, identify systems that maintain poverty, and discuss how poverty influences an individual's mental health and neurological functioning. The presentation will also highlight resilience and strengths in low-income families.

Learning Objectives:

1. Identify the impact of poverty on behavior, health, and decision-making.
2. Discuss recent research findings related to the relationship between poverty and mental health.
3. Explore the concrete experience of people in poverty and identify societal biases that may impact treatment.

Presenter:



Amanda Terrell, Psy.D. is a licensed psychologist specializing in work with families and adolescents. Dr. Terrell's experience includes family therapy, clinical supervision, community mental health, residential treatment for adolescents, acute inpatient populations, psychological evaluation and trauma-informed program implementation. She currently serves as the Chief of Residential Clinical Services at Highridge Family Center, a trauma informed residential program certified by the Sanctuary Institute. Highridge is a short-term residential facility and part of the Residential Treatment and Family Counseling Division of Palm Beach County, Youth Services Department. Dr. Terrell is responsible for clinical services and operations at the 60-bed residential facility serving youth ages 11 to 16 in Palm Beach County. Before assuming her role as clinical director, she was the trauma-informed care coordinator for the facility, spearheading efforts to obtain certification in the Sanctuary Model. Dr. Terrell also provides clinical supervision to graduate trainees. She obtained her doctoral degree from Pacific University in Hillsboro, Oregon. Her pre-doctoral internship was completed at Palm Beach County, Youth Affairs Division, and she completed her post-doctoral fellowship at Jackson Memorial Hospital/University of Miami Miller School of Medicine.
