Description:

This training will define early attachment for participants and identify the tasks and challenges children face in the development of their attachment. The training will help participants to articulate why early attachment is so vital for children and explore parenting and attachment research and tools used in clinical care.

Learning Objectives:

- 1. Explain early attachment and identify early attachment tasks and challenges for children.
- 2. Explore why early attachment is so important for development and identify possible attachment challenges that can continue into adolescence.
- 3. Outline parenting tasks and identify professional strategies based on John Gottman's attachment research.

Presenter:



Kelly Everson, Psy.D. is co-owner and Florida Licensed Psychologist at Palm Beach Behavioral Health and Wellness (PBBHW). Additionally, Dr. Everson serves as the Training Director for PBBHW's psychology training programs. She specializes in psychotherapy and assessment of children, adolescents and families. Dr. Everson is experienced in group therapy with adolescents and parents, individual therapy with children, adolescents and adults, and family therapy. Dr. Everson leads the Autism Spectrum Clinic at PBBHW and primarily works with children, adolescents and adults diagnosed with ASD. She has worked with this population since 2006 and feels renewed every time she sees change in her clients- particularly when they have social victories! She is excited to host social skills groups for children and adolescents and always looks to add parent involvement and support to these groups. Helping parents through her work with children and adolescents is her passion. In addition to ASD, Dr. Everson has worked with a variety of presenting problems, including Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), mood disorders, peer pressure, and bullying. Dr. Everson has extensive experience completing full psychological and psychoeducational evaluations with children and adolescents and often attends Individualized Education Plan (IEP) meetings in the schools for her clients. Dr. Everson is a certified facilitator in John Gottman's 'Bringing Baby Home' program for new parents and regularly holds parenting workshops and classes in the community. Dr. Everson received her bachelor's degree in biology and psychology from the University of Wisconsin in Madison and continued her education at the Illinois School of Professional Psychology in Chicago, earning a Master's and Doctorate in Clinical Psychology with a specialization in Family Psychology.
