Description:

This session will present an overview of sexuality and sexual conditioning, as well as a developmental perspective on healthy sexual expression. The session will focus on typical developmental childhood sexual expression, and present ways to differentiate between normative and potentially problematic sexual behavior in children.

- 1. Explain the impact of culture and sexual conditioning on healthy sexual development.
- 2. Distinguish between developmentally appropriate sexual expression and potentially problematic sexual behaviors in children.
- 3. Recognize the importance of sexuality education as part of effective sexual abuse prevention.



Presenter:

Lawrence Siegel, MA, CSE, AASECT, is a Clinical Sexologist and Certified Sexuality Educator. In addition to being Director of Education & Training for Sage Institute for Family Development, Lawrence serves on college and university faculty, as well as faculty at Modern Sex Therapy Institutes. As an educator, trainer, and consultant for the past 30 years, he has traveled extensively and is recognized as a leading educator in the area of sexuality; particularly developmental sexuality, sexuality and substance use, medical sexology and sexual therapies. Lawrence has also published numerous book chapters and articles in such areas as sexual development, challenging the "sex addiction" model, sexual changes in aging adults, sex and drug-linked behavior, relationships, and enhancing sexual experiences. He is often quoted in popular media and can be heard on radio and internet as co-host of *Sex Talk with the Siegel Brothers*.
