Description:

Psychopharmacology is the study of the use of medications in treating mental disorders. The complexity of this field requires continuous stud in order to keep current with new advances. This introductory level training will review the extreme importance of appropriate initial diagnosis, consideration of all appropriate treatment interventions, the need for communication amongst members of the treatment team, and childhood psychopharmacology.

- 2. Determine when to seek out potential psychopharmacologic intervention.
- 3. Identify available psychopharmacologic treatment options for children and adolescents.
