









Purpose

The Summer Camp Scholarship Program is a public and private initiative providing a summer camp experience to children from low-income families. Families whose income is at or below 150% of the Federal Poverty Guideline are eligible to apply for a scholarship. In 2011, over 64,000 children aged 17 and below were identified as living in poverty. Many children are spending too much of their day without adult supervision or protection. Often, due solely to their family's inability to afford a summer day camp program, children are left alone in their homes, left in the care of older siblings or unsupervised on the streets. Children who are idle during the summer time are more likely to become involved in the juvenile justice system, join gangs, use illegal drugs or become pregnant. Without summer camp and other child care measures, hundreds of children are left home alone in substandard child care situations or caring for each other. Constructive activities, good supervision and positive relationships with adults and other children are needed to gain positive outcomes. Summer camp programs contain those needed items. However, without a scholarship, they are beyond the reach of most lowincome families in Palm Beach County.

Background

The Summer Camp Scholarship Program was established in 1995 and since that time has awarded in excess of 32,542 of scholarships. The Palm Beach County Division of Human and Veteran Services assumed the operational responsibility for the Summer Camp Scholarship Program from August 2006-2014, serving all of Palm Beach County. As of January 2015, Palm Beach County's Youth Services Department's Outreach and Community Programming Division assumed all responsibilities for the Summer Camp Scholarship Program. This Program pays full tuition and associated fees for eligible children to attend day camp during the summer months. To be eligible, the household income must fall within 150% of the Federal Poverty Level Guideline. Parents select a camp choice from a list of approved providers that accept the summer camp scholarship.

Program Summary

This year, the Summer Camp Scholarship Program funded 91 Summer Camps, of which 76 were Regular Summer Camp Providers and 15 School Readiness Providers in low-income areas throughout Palm Beach County. School Readiness Summer Camp Providers have increased by almost 50% from 2015. School Readiness Programs provide a curriculum that assist in preventing summer learning loss. For the second year, the Spelling Bee Competition was held for all Summer Camps to participate. More than 50% of the approved camps and their children participated in the competition. The Youth Services Department extended scholarships to children involved in the Juvenile Justice System and Bridges for the 2016 Summer Camp Scholarship Program and plan to continue to include them each summer.




