## NOTICE PALM BEACH COUNTY

On March 4, 2009, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) awarded Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP1) funding in the amount of \$27,700,340 to the Palm Beach County CDBG Entitlement Jurisdiction (which at the time only excluded the Cities of West Palm Beach, Boynton Beach, Delray Beach, and Boca Raton). In order to secure these funds, the County submitted a funding application to HUD which consisted of an Amendment to its Action Plan for FY 2007-08 reflecting its proposed NSP activities. At this time, the County is amending the Action Plan in order to re-distribute funds within the County Operated First and Second Mortgage Program.

## 30th Amendment to the Annual Consolidated Plan for FY 2007-08

The proposed 30<sup>th</sup> Amendment to the FY 2007-08 Action Plan entails decreasing the amount budgeted to provide first and/or second mortgages to homebuyers earning less than 50% of the area median income (AMI) by \$1,000,000 and assigning these funds to provide first and/or second mortgages to homebuyers with incomes between 51% and 120% of the AMI (see table below):

The original plan projected that 70 low/moderate income eligible homebuyers would receive assistance to acquire housing, however to date, over 80 low/moderate income homebuyers have benefited from this program.
