## NOTICE PALM BEACH COUNTY

On March 4, 2009, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) awarded Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP1) funding in the amount of \$27,700,340 to the Palm Beach County CDBG Entitlement Jurisdiction (which at the time only excluded the Cities of West Palm Beach, Boynton Beach, Delray Beach, and Boca Raton). In order to secure these funds, the County submitted a funding application to HUD which consisted of an Amendment to its Action Plan for FY 2007-08 reflecting its proposed NSP activities. At this time, the County is amending the Action Plan in order to re-allocate funds from Program Income to the Residential Redevelopment Program.

## 31st Amendment to the Action Plan for FY 2007-08

The proposed 31<sup>st</sup> Amendment to the FY 2007-08 Action Plan entails the re-allocation of NSP1 Program Income funds in the amount of \$96,439 to the Community Land Trust of Palm Beach County (CLT of PBC) under the Residential Redevelopment Program in order to rehabilitate two (2) single family housing units located at 5904 Corson Place, Lake Worth and 235 Bobwhite Road, Royal Palm Beach. Both units were acquired by the CLT of PBC using NSP1 funds. The additional funding will bring to \$1,115,852.60 the amount of NSP1 funds granted to the CLT of PBC.
