## **Article By Commissioner Weiss**

Mr. Krieg provided an overview of Commissioner Gregg K. Weiss's article concerning the issue of parking spot requirements creating an obstacle to the development of affordable housing in Palm Beach County. He proposed that the item should be included in the CAH's recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners (BCC).

#### VIII. Member Comments

Mr. Serrano provided an update about the BCC's recent actions regarding the allocation of housing bond funds. He also discussed the status of the projects that had been conceptually approved by the BCC.

Ms. Howard stated that HED was collaborating with the developers of the Village of Valor and Judge Rodgers projects to pursue alternative funding sources. She also explained that staff was actively working with developers to advance the projects to the underwriting phase.

Discussion ensued regarding the time frame of the process from underwriting through completion of the projects.

Mr. Serrano noted that of ten out of the eleven conceptually approved projects were rental developments.

Ms. Howard stated that a discussion of the housing voucher rental assistance program would take place at the July 9, 2024, BCC meeting.

Mr. Krieg commended Commissioner Mack Bernard for his service on the BCC and for his advocacy regarding the housing bond.

(CLERK'S NOTE: The Partners for Housing Presentation was taken up at this time.)

Terri Murray, representing Partners for Housing, provided an overview of the organization's history, mission, and accomplishments from 2016 through 2024. She emphasized the importance of addressing the county's critical housing shortage while advocating for the individuals most in need.

Ms. Robbins inquired about the organization's strategies for attracting lenders.

Ms. Murray responded that the most effective approach had been to obtain lender sponsorships and memberships. She also mentioned that Partners for Housing had received a seed grant from the Community Foundation.

Mr. Krieg invited Partners for Housing to review the CAH's recommendations and provide input.

Discussion ensued regarding the time frame for drafting the CAH's recommendations report and submitting it to the BCC for approval.

Mr. Krieg provided an update regarding House Bill 1365, which concerned unauthorized public camping and public sleeping. He discussed the formulation of a strategic plan to help the County and municipalities mitigate issues arising from the legislation.

Ms. Fields stated that the BCC was scheduled to discuss the item at a future meeting.

Discussion ensued regarding the challenges presented by the newly enacted legislation.

Mr. Krieg noted that the 2,000 individuals without stable housing had been identified within the county.

Ms. Howard discussed the new countywide housing dashboard, which was designed to help residents locate affordable and workforce housing units.

In response to a request by Mr. Krieg, Mr. Serrano agreed that staff would provide the housing dashboard link to the CAH members.
