Re: Municipal Service Taxing Unit Service Levels

Dear Chair Snyder,

Large areas of Palm Beach County receive fire rescue services through a taxpayer funded Municipal Services Taxing Unit ("MSTU"). Palm Beach County's MSTU has been an invaluable tool in providing best in class fire rescue services to the citizens of Palm Beach County. Long range planning and budgeting are paramount to being able to provide fire rescue services at such a consistently high level of quality. Decades of planning are necessary to properly site, fund and construct new fire infrastructure to accommodate the consistent population growth that has been experienced in Palm Beach County.

The annexation of unincorporated property in Palm Beach County has occurred more frequently in recent years. As unincorporated property has been annexed from inside the MSTU boarders there have been increasing instances of taxpayers being forced to fund duplicative fire rescue infrastructure in the annexed MSTU areas as the annexing municipality seeks to provide services to the newly annexed properties even though the properties already receive fire rescue services from the MSTU.

Given that it takes multiple years, often over a decade, for the MSTU to plan and implement fire service infrastructure investments, it would be impossible for either the MSTU or a future annexing municipality to predict these scenarios that drive duplicative taxpayer investments. As such, this proposal provides a stable framework for the planning, implementation and provision of fire rescue services in Palm Beach County while ensuring that taxpayers do not make duplicative investments in fire rescue infrastructure and municipalities can still annex unincorporated property.

Given the cross-jurisdictional nature of this matter it is necessary for this proposal to advance through the delegation's local bill process. We look forward to working with the delegation to advance the interests of Palm Beach County's taxpayers.

## Local Bill Summary

The local bill revises the impacts of annexation within Palm Beach County to avoid adverse health and safety impacts to the citizens and visitors of the county.

The local bill provides a method to allow the Palm Beach County Fire/Rescue Municipal Service Taxing Units ("PBFire MSTU") to avoid adverse financial impacts associated with annexations within its boundaries, while at the same time not restricting municipalities' ability to annex.

With the recent increase in property values, municipalities are beginning to annex tax-desirable properties within the PBFire MSTU. Historically, municipalities do not annex less desirable properties but rather properties that pay more taxes than the cost of services provided are targeted.

By annexing tax-desirable properties within the PBFire MSTU, there is a shift of fire expenses onto remaining district residents. As a direct result of the annexation, a PBFire MSTU may either need to levy a higher millage rate or decrease the level of services. As the PBFire MSTU's tax base continues to decrease due to annexations, the PBFire MSTU may become economically inefficient. This issue is even more complicated when a municipality annexes property that includes a PBFire MSTU fire station. Either the Palm Beach County firefighters do not provide to the annexed property even though they may be the closest unit to the emergency due to their fire station being located within the annexing municipality, or they provide the service for free. In this scenario, the remaining property owners within the PBFire MSTU would be supplementing services to the annexing city for free.

The local bill provides that the following applies to all annexations within Palm Beach County after January 1, 2026:

- Municipalities may still expand their boundaries in accordance with Chapter 171, Florida Statutes.
  - The ability to expand is not impacted; only the service provider for fire and emergency services is impacted.
- The PBFire MSTU's boundaries contract upon the annexation, just as it occurs today. Double taxation is avoided.
- Palm Beach County firefighters continue to provide service to the annexed property and remain the Authority Having Jurisdiction.
- Every year, the annexing municipality will pay the County the amount that the PBFire MSTU would have collected in ad valorem taxes and assessments if the property had not been annexed.
- To continue to provide flexibility and ensure that the health and safety of citizens and visitors is paramount, the County and the annexing municipality may enter into an agreement that provides the annexing municipality to assume services.

This local bill does provide exceptions to general law, which is allowed as a local bill. In addition, this concept of continuing fire service following annexation has been adopted for several independent special fire districts in the State, as these districts similarly faced harmful annexations.

Although this local bill does limit municipalities' home rule powers, the Florida Constitution grants the Legislature the authority to limit municipalities authority.

BILL ORIGINAL YEAR

A bill to be entitled

An act relating to Palm Beach County; providing that properties within a municipal service taxing unit whose primary purpose is to provide fire protection, rescue, and emergency medical services remains the service provider to property that has been annexed after a specified date; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. To avoid adverse impacts to the health and safety of citizens and residents of unincorporated Palm Beach County that may occur due to certain municipal annexations, notwithstanding Section 125.011, Florida Statutes, or any other general law, special act, municipal charter, or ordinance of a local government to the contrary, a municipal service taxing unit whose primary purpose is to provide fire protection, rescue, and emergency medical services shall remain the fire protection, rescue, and emergency medical services provider to real property annexed after January 1, 2026. Following the annexation, the geographical boundaries of the municipal service taxing unit shall contract to exclude the annexed real property and the county may not levy ad valorem taxes through the municipal service taxing unit on the annexed real property. Annually, the municipality shall pay the county, for the benefit

of the municipal service taxing unit, an amount equal to the ad valorem taxes and assessments that would have been collected had the real property remained in the municipal service taxing unit. The county, through the municipal services unit, remains the Authority Having Jurisdiction and may continue to collect impact fees and other fees from the annexed real property. Through a written agreement approved by the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners and the applicable annexing municipality, the county and annexing municipality may agree for the annexing municipality to assume fire protection, rescue, or emergency medical service to the annexed territory.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
