- Or the retreat, budgeted \$10,000 but spent \$11, 352.61 (\$1,352.61 difference)
- Requesting to move funding from both CC Member Incentives (\$2,0000) and CC Member Travel (\$357.94)
- Have to allocate \$2,012.95 for Food and Beverage
- Outreach remains the same
- Needs assessment is reduced by \$1,007.62
- Need to do this to cover current expenses
- Still need to pay Michael Hager

B. Priority and Allocation Update from P & A Meeting Nov. 7th (10-15 minutes)

- Changed how funds are allocated at the beginning of the grant year
- Estimated what the Carryover would be in April
- Over allocated what they had for the Grant year in anticipation of the Carryover
- After receiving some reimbursements, the Carryover was about \$2,000 less than what had been expected
- Do not have any dollars to increase any budgets
- Almost all the agencies have been able to budget properly for the year
- Plan to do another analysis in January
- At this point, it looks like we will be fully expending
