Motion to accept the adopting of the updated Florida Medicaid Formulary for their local pharmaceutical assistance program, which includes new medications for various conditions but no changes to HIV medications. The formulary adoption aims to provide broad access to medications for people with HIV.

- EFA: Category A Caps/Limitations was updated to: Up to 4 accesses per grant year for no more than a combined total of \$1,000, and/or housing assistance as one access per 12 month period to equal one month of rent and/or one security deposit.
- Food Bank: Unit definition will now be 1 unit = 1 voucher or 1 food box. If a client is at or below 150 FPL they would get \$75 voucher/food box and clients between 151-200 would get the \$50 voucher/food box. Each unit is worth \$25 still.
