The National HIV Testing Day (NHTD) 2009 was a great success in Palm Beach County. There were several events held around the county, at which 367 HIV tests were done. Pictures of the events are located on page 4.

Families First's TOPWA (Targeted Outreach for Pregnant Woman with AIDS) Program held their first annual health fair in West Palm Beach. There was face painting, a bounce house, free haircuts, a DJ, and of course free HIV & STD testing, as well as pregnancy testing. There was an HIV/AIDS education program throughout the day.

Compass, Inc. held an event displaying the AIDS Quilt at their new location in Lake Worth.

St. James Missionary Baptist church, in Riviera Beach, held a fair with HIV testing and free food and drinks.

Thursday, June 25<sup>th</sup> FAU hosted a huge health fair at the Boca Raton campus. The event was a great success. Of the 367 NHTD HIV tests administered, 97 of them were done at this event. There was food, music and a live broadcast on 102.3! Many of the students were getting tested so they could bring their test results to the Show U Know Project, www.showuknow.org, for a free concert ticket that weekend in Fort Lauderdale.

At the June 27, 2009 meeting of the Palm Beach County Board of County Commission Commissioner Koons presented a proclamation declaring June 27, 2009 as "National HIV Testing Day in Palm Beach County". This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> consecutive year that the county has recognized NHTD.

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

### National HIV/AIDS Strategy

In a letter to the AIDS Directors nationwide dated July 7, 2009, Julie Scofield and Laura Hanen of NASTAD provided a detailed update on the White House's National AIDS Policy.

In an attempt to keep the HIV/AIDS community of Palm Beach County up to date on the developments of the National HIV/AIDS Strategy, I have included excerpts, with minor editing, from the letter below.

"Jeff Crowley, Director of the White House Office of National AIDS Policy and Senior Advisor on Disability Policy, has announced the Administration's plan for developing a National HIV/AIDS Strategy (NHAS). As promised during the campaign, the development of the NHAS is one of the President's top HIV/AIDS policy priorities.

The three key goals for the NHAS are:

- Reducing HIV incidence
- Increasing access to care
- Reducing HIV-related health disparities

The NHAS will be developed by an inter-agency committee made up of representatives from federal agencies and the White House and is likely to include persons from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), National Institutes of Health (NIH), Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), Veterans Administration (VA), National Economic Council, National Security Council,

and the White House Office of Public Engagement. Jeff will chair the committee and expects the NHAS to be developed by early 2010.

While the NHAS will be developed by the federal government, the Obama Administration is committed to developing the NHAS through a process that is inclusive of a broad range of perspectives and stakeholders, and is conducted in a transparent manner. There will be ten town hall meetings around the country to include major epicenters of the epidemic, rural areas, the South, a Native American community, and one of the territories. The first town hall meeting will take place during the National HIV Prevention Conference on Tuesday, August 25 at 6:30 pm.



There will be a website dedicated to the NHAS along the lines of the one developed for health reform (www.healthreform.gov) and all town hall meetings will be webcast. The White House will encourage community discussions or house parties in communities around the country with a portal on the website to submit recommendations resulting from those discussions. Jeff believes national dialog on HIV/AIDS is just as important as the NHAS itself.

Jeff indicated that by having the federal agencies involved in the development of the NHAS, the agencies will be invested and held accountable for carrying out the plan. He also noted that by

creating the interagency committee there is greater flexibility under the Federal Advisory Committee Act in the types of meetings they can hold with stakeholders. The Committee will be convening small meetings with experts on specific topic areas. The proceedings of the meetings will be made available to the public.

The Presidential Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS (PACHA) will have a yet to be defined role in the NHAS as a mechanism for feedback and monitoring implementation. PACHA's charter ends on July 31 and presents the Administration with an opportunity to make changes to its focus and membership.

As to where viral hepatitis and STD fits into the NHAS, Jeff indicated addressing these diseases will fall into the category of reducing HIV incidence goal of the NHAS.

Community advocates have urged that the town hall meetings be open to a broad constituency beyond HIV/AIDS providers including people living with HIV/AIDS, social justice and philanthropic organizations, and the business sector, and that there are mechanisms to provide input beyond the town halls."
