Dr. Davis gave an update stating that addiction services are being provided by JFK. There has been disagreement about how the services are being provided (a dedicated Unit or ER) JFK prioritizes based on status, triage, and protocol

Dr Keehn shard that originally there were 10 dedicated beds but the effort is now moved to "ER B"

Beds are close to the ER and patients who need high dose suboxone can be stabilized quickly

JFK has a Social Worker and Health Care District case manager (1.8 FTE each) nearly full time. They are on call overnight as needed.

An After Action Review was suggested and Dr Green indicated this is a typical part of evaluating county programs and expenditures. Community Services will assess what is needed in terms of next steps. Dr Green is looking to the review, advice of the Advisory Committee and the Master Plan Update to inform next steps.

John Hulick stated that the After Action Review fits into the current scope of evaluation work with FAU and will be completed without delay. The Master Plan Update and Settlement Recommendations will be part of a coordinated effort.

Wrap up comments included the need to understand lessons learned in other ASUs in Florida and the importance of connecting to essential services and behavioral health.
