Florida ADAP Changes and Our Commitment to You

Dear Palm Beach County Ryan White Clients,

I'm writing to share an important update about proposed changes to Florida's AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP) that are expected to begin March 1, 2026. These changes have been announced on the [Florida Department of Health \(FDOH\) website](#).

First and foremost, please know that the PBC HIV Elimination Services team is working hard to help you keep your HIV medical care and medications. We are reviewing what these proposed changes could mean for people with HIV in Palm Beach County, and what options are available for you to continue getting the care and treatment you need.

Many of you have received letters from FDOH, and we understand that this news may feel sudden and stressful, and you may have questions. Local Ryan White programs, community partners, and advisory groups were not consulted and did not receive advance notice before the state announced these proposed changes. So we will be working through these changes alongside you. You are not alone!

What you can do right now:

- Keep taking your HIV medications.
- Keep your medical appointments.
- If you get a letter or notice about ADAP or medication coverage that you do not understand, call your case manager to ask what it means and what to do next.
