#### **MEETING MINUTES**

#### I. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

Houston Tate, OCR Director, called the meeting to order at 10:02 a.m., welcomed everyone to the meeting, and introduced the OCR staff. William Wynn, OCR Senior Planner, introduced the CCRT members and Mr. Tate introduced the presenter Dr. James Green, Director of the Palm Beach County Community Services Department.

### II. DEPARTMENT UPDATES

  - ➤ HED issued RFP offering 4.6 million dollars in loan funding to developers for new construction multi-family rental housing to serve households with income up to 120% if the area median income. On Friday, February 17<sup>th</sup> there will be an workshop for this RFP

#### **IV. PRESENTATIONS**

- Dr. James Green, Director of the Palm Beach County Community Services Department
  - Dr. Green began by introducing the Community Services Department leadership team.

- Mr. Green started his presentation by sharing information on how the Community Services
  Department is aligned with the Board of County Commissioners' (BCC) strategic priorities,
  which include Economic Development, Housing and Homelessness, Environmental
  Protection, Infrastructure, Public Safety, and Substance Use & Behavior Disorders. Three
  of these priorities are directly aligned with the work that Community Services does.
  - 1. Economic Development: To promote economic revitalization, business development, and retention by driving the creation of employment opportunities while reducing disparities and improving the quality of life for everyone.
  - Housing and Homelessness: To promote the quality of life through targeted programs that address the housing and homelessness needs of the residents of Palm Beach County.
  - 3. Substance Use & Behavior Disorders: To address the substance misuse crisis and behavior disorders by providing evidence-based prevention, medication-assisted treatment, and recovery support services.
    - Community Services funds approximately 125 non-profit and programs throughout PBC
    - Community Services services they provide are primarily in the areas of Housing & Homelessness, Economic Mobility and Behavior Health and Substance Use Disorders among other services including HIV. There are plans and specific goals to provide these services.
    - ➤ PBC has 71,000 millionaire households, 44 billionaires, more than 60,000 children are living in poverty
    - Within the PBC School system, the data shows that black male third graders only about 30% are reading at a proficient level.
    - There are comprehensive plans that are being used to provide the most efficient and effective services. At the center of these plans are organizations that are responsible for making sure that the system is operating properly. One part of the system affects another so it is imperative that the system operates properly. The organizations work together to cover gaps in the system where needed. The Citizens Advisory Committee assesses the need, planning, implementation and evaluation of the system.
    - Community Services areas of focus have three comprehensive plans that is related. Securing Our Future PBC, The Homeless Plan and Facing The Crisis
    - ➤ The goal is to reduce the poverty rate by 10% over the next ten years. The way this will be done is by the three Ps. People, Partnerships and Policy.

# **Questions**

Bonnie Hodges, San Castle Resident

- What can be done to help a neighborhood family that is living in poverty in San Castle? Dr. Green stated that an assessment needs to done. PBC will explore ways they can possibly help if the resident is willing to accept the help. The property owner needs to be held accountable. In order for something to happen with this property, there is a process. The health department and code enforcement needs to be involved in the process. In the interim, the family needs a place to go. Dr. Green advised Community Services staff is currently looking into this families issue and will work with the family if the family were willing.
- ➤ Ms. Hodges inquired about the street sign on Monroe Blvd and Overlook Rd. Stated this sign is misleading. Houston Tate replied that a date would be set with Ms. Hodges for a site visit along with Traffic Engineering to observe this issue.
- Ms. Hodges inquired can trees be planted in a retention pond? Fadi Nassar replied

- that he would have to get the answer for this question. He will have the answer for Ms. Hodges at the site visit.
- Ms. Hodges stated that the traffic is excessive along Overlook Rd. Houston Tate replied that this issue will also be observed during the site visit.
- > The retention pond on San Castle Blvd is overgrown and unkempt and should be converted to something useful for the community. Casey Pranckun replied that
