INITIATIVES & PROGRAMS

CCRT and GTAC Coordination

The OCR facilitates, and collaborates with other County Departments on, the Countywide Community Revitalization Team (CCRT) and Glades Technical Advisory Committee.

The CCRT was created to coordinate stabilization/revitalization activities in designated Palm Beach County neighborhoods.

The CCRT meets the 3rd Tuesday of every month at the Vista Center, in West Palm Beach, and focuses on eastern Palm Beach County. GTAC, which focuses on the Glades communities, meets the third Thursday of every month rotating locations in Belle Glade, South Bay, Pahokee, and Canal Point.

Regularly scheduled meetings allow County departments and residents to exchange information about what departments are doing, receive input from the residents, prevent duplication, concentrate efforts at the same time, and determine what is working and what is not.

Abundant Community Initiative (ACI)

A neighborhood engagement and community organizing framework that provides tools for neighbors to get to know and connect with each other at the block level, shape community life according to residents' vision for their neighborhood, build community identity and pride through shared ownership and responsibility, increase safety and neighborhood wellbeing, and foster an environment of care for one another.cThe overall goal of the initiative is to help communities to be places where people know their neighbors, watch out for each other, and enjoy many opportunities for social, educational and recreational interaction.

Back to School PBC!

Provides free backpacks and school supplies to Palm Beach County students in need from Pre-K through 12th grade enrolled in the public or charter school system. Participating students also receive free school physicals, immunizations, and haircuts to ensure they are ready for the first day of school. In addition, it provides families with exposure to other community resources to help them on their road to selfsufficiency and improve their children's success in school.

Neighborhood Engagement and Transformation (NEAT) Grants Program

Provides funding to neighborhood based groups and/or organizations for projects that improve the quality of life in their communities. The NEAT Grants Program enables residents to develop small collaborative community projects and see their ideas through to completion. Grants may be used for a wide variety of activities and projects, and resident groups are encouraged to think in new ways about what will work in their communities and with whom they might partner. NEAT grants are intended to build the skills and capacity of project leaders to transform their neighborhoods

Neighborhood Street Lighting (NSL) Program

Provides funding for the installation and maintenance of citizen petitioned streetlights at approved locations along County owned and maintained roadways in designated CCRT areas that experience above-average nighttime criminal activity, as well as unsafe pedestrian and vehicular mobility conditions.

Neighborhood Speed Hump Program

Provides funding for the installation and maintenance of citizen petitioned speed humps at approved locations along County owned and maintained roadways within CCRT areas to improve both vehicular and pedestrian safety.

Resident Empowerment Program (REP)

A hands-on educational course on community revitalization and civic engagement, intended to help community residents to be better informed about local government, as well as learn how to communicate effectively, recruit and retain volunteers, keep communities safe, leveraging community assets, resolve problems and access resources.
