

- 101 projects / 3,300+ units subject to WHP
- 1,300 rentals built or under development
- 400+ for-sale units built or under development
- 227 for-sale units sold
- In Lieu Fees: more than \$17 million paid
- 1,011 residents participated in WHP homebuyer workshops conducted by UF/IFAS and HED






## How Many People Experiencing Homelessness Live in Palm Beach County?

#### 2023 Point-In-Time Count








The Fire Rescue Mobile Integrated Health Team often identifies challenges and communicates them to Community Services to find a solution together to meet the needs of those we mutually serve.




Fire Rescue's Mobile Integrated Health Team assisted over 6,300 patients in 2023 with 574 identifying themselves as being homeless.

Over 26,732 households were served with emergency funding during this time and over \$111 million was spent on preventing homelessness in our community.


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
## State of Housing: Recent Economic and Housing Conditions

**Unemployment rate** in Palm Beach County was **3.2%** in October 2023 compared to the Statewide rate of **2.8%** and the National rate of **3.9%**.






## State of Housing: Recent Economic and Housing Conditions



At **8.5%** in December 2023, the **Prime Interest Rate** is at its highest since 2000.

Chart 1. Over-the-year percent change in CPI-U, Miami-Fort Lauderdale-West Palm Beach, FL, October 2020–October 2023








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


#### Affordable Housing Programs 2021–2023

#### **PARTNERSHIPS:**

**BJA Grant** – In 2022, Palm Beach County was awarded the FY 22 Improving Adult and Juvenile Crisis Stabilization and Community Reentry Program grant from the Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance for \$750,000 over three years. This grant will support coordination and provide comprehensive treatment, recovery, and other supportive reentry services, including housing to adults experiencing mental health, substance use, or co-occurring disorders who are being released from the County jail and returning to South Bay, Belle Glade and Pahokee.

**Reentry Resource Fair** – PBC Clerk & Comptroller in collaboration with PBC Public Safety Department hosted a resource fair in West Palm Beach on September 9, 2023, showcasing housing programs and other reentry services in the community.




