What Are Property Taxes?

- The assessed value of property times the millage rate
- The amount of money you get taxed based on the value of your home
- These taxes fund essential public services
 - Public Education
 - First Responders
 - Parks, Roads, Community Services, Transportation, Libraries, Other Government Services
 - Special Districts



What Is A Millage?

- Mill = \$1 assessed for each \$1,000 of taxable value
- A property valued at \$250,000 pays \$250 per mill
- The property value is set by the Property Appraiser
- Homestead property values
 - Save Our Homes (SOH) 3% or CPI, whichever is less
 - Other Exemptions
 - Senior Citizens
 - Widow/Widower
 - Totally and Permanently Disabled (Non-Veteran)
 - Veterans/Military/First Responders
 - Historic Property Rehabilitation
 - Nonprofit Organizations
 - Non-homestead property 10% increase cap




Portability

- SOH allows residents to transfer tax benefits up to \$500,000 from a Florida home with a homestead exemption to a new home within Florida that qualifies for a homestead exemption
 - New residence has a higher market value:
 portability = market value assessed value of the former home
 - If the new residence has a lower market value, you can transfer a
 percentage of the difference from old property to new property
- New residence must be established before January 1
- Portability application deadline March 1





Palm Beach County Residents



- 1.6 million people reside in Palm Beach County
- 57% live in 39 cities/municipalities
- 43% live in unincorporated Palm Beach County



Taxing Districts

- The County is responsible for four separate taxing districts
- Each district has a unique area and its own separate millage rate
- Funds are not allowed to move between boxes
- There are two voted debt millage rates
 - Countywide GO Housing Bond




Taxable Property Values

Total Value Countywide: \$342,954,849,990 Total Parcels: 659,124




Homesteaded Property Values

Total Homesteaded Value Countywide: \$135,005,704,823 Total Homesteaded Parcels: 369,383




Of the 73% over 65, \$45,147,381,518, or 46% of taxable value comes from homes valued over \$1 million.

Taxing District Revenues Total Revenues: \$2,167,197,850










Revenue and Expenses By Category Total Budget: \$9,606,627,411

House Proposals

- October 16, 2025 Memorandum sent from the Office of the Speaker containing eight proposals
- Prohibits law enforcement funding reduction
- Exempts school taxes



O HJR 201

- Elimination of non-school homestead property taxes
- Proposed by Representative Steele
- County Impact:

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- Libraries \$43,911,415 44% of Property Taxes
- Fire Rescue \$208,777,235 43% of Property Taxes
- State Revenue Conference
 - Palm Beach County \$963,577,666



- Phases out non-school homestead property taxes over ten years
- \$100,000 additional exemption each year
- Reduced to zero after ten years
- Proposed by Representative Miller
- County Impact Year One:

 Libraries 	\$33,101,303	33% of Property Taxes
 Fire Rescue 	\$151,088,865	31% of Property Taxes

- State Revenue Conference
 - Palm Beach County \$201,430,583

- All Florida residents 65 and older are exempt from paying non-school homestead property taxes
- Proposed by Representative Porras
- County Impact:

 Libraries 	\$32,073,926	32% of Property Taxes
 Fire Rescue 	\$145,671,867	30% of Property Taxes

- State Revenue Conference
 - Palm Beach County \$434,128,354

- New homestead exemption for non-school property taxes equal to 25% of the assessed property value
- Applies to current homeowners and first-time home buyers
- Proposed by Representative Abbott

State Revenue Conference

Palm Beach County \$241,349,262

- If a homesteaded property owner has property insurance, they receive an extra \$100,000 exemption on non-school property taxes
- Proposed by Representative Busatta
- County Impact:

 General Fund 	\$485,722,398	72% of BCC Depts and Capital
 Libraries 	\$33,101,303	33% of Property Taxes
 Fire Rescue 	\$151,088,865	31% of Property Taxes

- State Revenue Conference
 - Palm Beach County \$145,387,903

- Portability cap eliminated
- Save Our Homes benefit can be transferred in its entirety, even if the new home is valued less than the old home
- Proposed by Representative Overdorf
- County Impact:

 General Fund 	\$957,167	0.14% of BCC Depts and Capital
 Libraries 	\$38,193	0.04% of Property Taxes
 Fire Rescue 	\$149,880	0.03% of Property Taxes

- State Revenue Conference
 - Palm Beach County \$4,917,820

- Assessed value growth slowed
 - 3% over three years for homesteaded property vs. current 3% per year increase
 - 15% over three years for non-homesteaded property vs. current 10% per year increase
- Proposed by Representative Griffitts

HB 215

- Changes to Statutes
 - Any increase in millage rate requires a 2/3 vote
 - Newly married couples can combine their Save Our Homes benefits
- Proposed by Representative Albert

 Libraries 	\$1.859	0.002% of Property Taxes

SJR 270/SB 272

- Homesteaded residents 65 or older are exempt from property taxes if they satisfy both conditions:
 - 1. Lived in the property for at least five years
 - 2. Yearly household income is less than \$350,000, with an annual cost of living adjustment
- Residents are not exempt from school district levies
- Disabled veterans who are 65 or older but do not qualify for the exemption will continue receiving existing benefits
- Proposed by Senator Bernard
- County Impact:

SJR 274/SB 276

- Assessments stop after homesteading for 20 continuous years
- Homesteading for at least 30 years qualifies for a 50% homestead exemption
 - Excludes school district taxes
- Those with multiple properties can combine ownership and residency to reach thresholds faster
- Proposed by Senator Bernard
- County Impact:
 - General Fund TBD
 - Libraries TBD
 - Fire Rescue TBD



SJR 278/SB 280

- If a new homesteaded property was assessed under \$500,000 before a change in ownership, the new assessment can not exceed 150% of the previously assessed value
- Standard homestead assessment rules apply in future years
- Proposed by Senator Bernard
- County Impact:

SJR 282/SB 284

- Assessed value of commercial property used by small businesses capped at 3% or Consumer Price Index, whichever is lower
- Assessed value lowered to just value if the calculated assessments are greater than market value
- If the property is no longer owned by a small business, the property will be reassessed at just value
- Proposed by Senator Bernard
- County Impact:

SB 286

- New formula to assess changes, additions, and improvements under \$100,000
 - Ratio of assessed value to just value
 - Excludes changes that replace most of the property or result in over 25% square foot increase
- Proposed by Senator Bernard


