Have An Evacuation Plan - The safest place for horses during a hurricane is to remove them from the area. If that is not possible, the next best solution is to turn them out in a large field with solid fencing and plenty of open space. If this also is not possible, you need to look at local evacuation plans. **Make arrangements and plans before the hurricane season begins to insure the safety and well being of you and your horse.**

If conditions permit, the Jim Brandon Equestrian Center (JBEC) will open for post-emergency sheltering on a first come, first served basis.

Please note that JBEC cannot be open for pre-storm evacuation.
