

## **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

Case managers work with youth and families to provide supportive services to achieve individualized goals.

#### Case managers are not probation or law enforcement officers.

The goal is to support and incentivize the youth's journey towards successful reentry.

#### Eligibility:

- Youth returning to PBC from incarceration in the juvenile justice system or sentenced as a minor within the adult criminal justice system.
- No offense or age exclusions.
- Youth previously involved with reentry program may return for services.

# **WHAT IS REENTRY?**

The process in which individuals return to the community from a period of incarceration within a criminal or juvenile justice system. Reentry begins at incarceration.

PRE-RELEASE

- Case manager assigned at sentencing.
- Meeting basic needs of family.
- Navigating justice system, reentry process, and social services.
- Providing assistance and services to meet needs and prepare for youth's return to the home.
- Individualized case planning.
- Long-term connections to community resources.
- Provide court advocacy.


