<p><b>Loggers' Run Park</b> - District Park "E" is a 54-acre district park that was completed in 2003. Its active recreational facilities are located on the County owned eastern 27-acres. The western 27 acres are leased to the County from the Loggers' Run Homeowners Association. The Lease Agreement required the County to build a storage garage and develop a trail system on this wooded 27-acre parcel. These improvements were completed in June 2008. <p><b>Peanut Island</b> - a boat basin was excavated from an upland area on the west side of the island. The boat basin features floating docks and provides access for small water craft. On the southeast corner of Peanut Island a rock-lined lagoon was developed for snorkeling. A boardwalk system was constructed to a floating dive platform, in the snorkeling lagoon, to provide easy access to the water. Paver brick and "tabbie" pathways interconnect pedestrian bridges (which lead to an "island feature"), an inlet observation rock groin and several picnic "chickies". <p><b>John Prince Memorial Park</b> – Therapeutic Recreation Center, Visa Arts Gymnasium, and therapeutic pool renovations. A 8,994 square foot facility for special population, parking, site lighting, infrastructure, 16,775 square foot gymnasium and arts center building, the facility includes multi-purpose sports court/performing art space with stage, game room, dance/aerobics studio, weight training room, food distribution area, storerooms, storage/mechanical rooms, offices, parking, site lighting and associated infrastructure. <p><b>John Prince Memorial Park</b> – Golf Learning Center. <p><b>John Prince Memorial Park</b> – Splash playground is an addition to the existing “Boundless Playground”, located at the north end of the park. <p><b>John Prince Memorial Park</b> – Square Lake Project. The wetland and restoration enhancement project was a joint project between ERM and the Parks and Recreation Department. The project included dredging and removing muck from the 11.74-acre Square Lake, scraping down four and a half acres of shoreline and constructing littoral shelves, replanting the area with native vegetation, and creating a canoe/kayak launch and two fishing piers. <p><b>Okeeheelee Park South</b> – Jim Brandon Equestrian. The equestrian center includes a covered, lighted show arena, two lighted show rings, three lighted training rings, a lighted open riding area includes two show rings with western event and team penning arena. Two jump courses, two dressage arenas, and two barns for 128 horses. Additional amenities include show office and general purpose building, concession building, equipment storage, general purpose building, electrical equipment/EMS building, manure receptacle building,</p>	11,615,688	65.70

<b>Riverbend Park</b> – the portion of the park located east of the river was opened to the public in August 2007. In December 2007, the County opened six miles of equestrian trails to the public and in April 2008 completed a vehicular bridge connecting the east and west sides of the park over the Loxahatchee River. <b>South County Regional – Osprey Point Golf Course.</b> A 27-Hole Golf Course with driving range, putting and chipping greens, pro-shop, food concession, golf manager and pro offices, restrooms maintenance building, golf cart "barn", an outdoor amphitheater with a sloped grass seating featuring an enclosed raised stage, dressing room building, service building, and restrooms, picnic pavilions, site lighting, parking and support infrastructure (under construction) <b>Sunset Cove Amphitheater.</b> This 9,930 square foot amphitheater has a 1,700 square foot stage with rear screen projection capability, a state of the art sound and light system, four dressing rooms with private attached restrooms and a production office, all air conditioned. The outdoor grass festival seating area will seat up to 3,000 spectators. Additional facilities for the public adjacent to the amphitheater are a large group picnic pavilion, restroom building, single table picnic shelters and ample parking. The grand opening was held on March 29, 2008. <b>Canine Cove Dog Park</b> and ADA accessible Playground. Canine Cove Dog Park is located near the new amphitheater and features three fenced areas for dogs, three gazebos, 34 benches, drinking fountains for people and dogs, and a pet wash station. The accessible playground is designed to eliminate barriers for children with disabilities with poured in place surfacing and accessible slides and equipment.
