Recycling Drop-Off Bins [aka Donation Boxes/Stations]

BCC Public Hearing June 5, 2012



Background

- In a letter dated February 15, 2012, and as discussed at the March 6, 2012 BCC Public Hearing and April 26, 2012 BCC Zoning Hearing, Gulfstream Goodwill has requested that the BCC consider adopting regulations that would prohibit "unattended" donation boxes/stations.
- A News Release advising the public of this Public Hearing has been posted on the PZ&B and Zoning Division web-pages.
- PZ&B identified several interested parties and notified them of this Public Hearing via mail (see letter dated May 7, 2012).
- As staff discussed with the Board on April 26, 2012, there has been proliferation of illegally placed donation boxes throughout the County.

Most Donation Boxes would be classified under ULDC Art. 4.B.1.A.104, **Recycling Drop Off Bin**. Typical requirements include but are not limited to:

- ✓ "A totally enclosed mobile structure containing no more than 4 cubic yards..."
- ✓ Zoning approval required.
- ✓ Location.
- ✓ Maintenance.
- ✓ Processing.
- ✓ Type of Materials.
- ✓ Signage.
- ✓ Number.

Larger Donation Boxes would be classified under ULDC Art. 4.B.1.A.106, Recycling Collection Station. Typical requirements include but are not limited to:

- ✓ A totally enclosed structure or mobile container, containing more than 4 cubic yards…"
- ✓ Zoning approval required.
- ✓ Type of Materials.
- ✓ Parking.



Typical Examples of Recycling Collection Stations:







- 1) Enforce Code as currently adopted with minor amendments to provide clarification.
- 2) Limit Donation Boxes or stations to manned versus unmanned.
- 3) Require labeling of boxes to reflect the name of the organization, to include if for profit or not for profit.
- 4) Eliminate the use of Donation Boxes or Recycling Stations.



- 1) Enforce Code as currently adopted with minor amendments to provide clarification.
 - PZ&B staff have identified numerous developments with illegally established Donation Boxes.
 - Several larger developments have multiple Donation Boxes.
 - Enforcement would require Zoning approval, compliance with ULDC regulations, and would limit each development to one Donation Box each.
 - Minor amendments recommended to clarify types of materials permitted to be accepted.

- 2) Limit Donation Boxes or Stations to manned versus unmanned.
 - Requested by Gulfstream Goodwill reasons include threat to charitable donations by for-profit businesses, cleanliness and safety, dangers during windstorm events, among others.





- 3) Require labeling of Donation Boxes to reflect the name of the organization, to include if for profit or not for profit.
 - The ULDC currently requires signage that clearly posts the name and phone number of a responsible party.
 - Most identified Donation Boxes include the required information, as well as not-for profit status* in addition to additional information regarding purpose such as reduce impacts to landfills, environmental benefits, or charitable giving.
 - Note that it would not be feasible for PZ&B to ascertain the validity of not-for profit status or whether or not profits went to organizational salaries or to actual charitable causes.

3) Require labeling of Donation Boxes to reflect the name of the organization, to include if for profit or not for profit.



- 4) Eliminate the use of Donation Boxes or Recycling Stations.
 - Would limit collections to facilities that provide for managed drop off – staffing.
 - Note According to the SWA, typical materials collected are defined by F.S. as "source separated" and "recovered materials" and are exempt from regulation as solid waste.
 - May need to consider benefits to society due to convenience of opportunities to recycle certain goods.
