

RESOLUTION NO. R-73-626

RESOLUTION APPROVING ZONING PETITION

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, as the governing body, pursuant to the authority vested in Chapter 163 and Chapter 125, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 70-863, Laws of Florida, Special Acts of 1970, is authorized and empowered to consider petitions relating to zoning; and

WHEREAS, the notice and hearing requirements as provided for in Chapter 402.5 of the Palm Beach County Zoning Code Ordinance No. 73-2 have been satisfied; and

WHEREAS, Petition No. 73-164 was presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County at its public hearing conducted on 27 September 1973.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, assembled in regular session this 27th day of September, 1973, that petition No. 73-164, the petition of TRINITY BAPTIST CHURCH OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, INC., by Reverend R. W. Young, Pastor, for a SPECIAL EXCEPTION TO ALLOW A CHURCH AND ACCESSORY BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES on the North 329.96 feet of the South 660 feet of the West 528.06 feet of the East 2178 feet of Section 13, Township 43 South, Range 42 East. Said property located on the west side of Hibiscus Circle, approximately 400 feet east of Military Trail (S.R. 809) and approximately one mile north of Okeechobee Boulevard (S.R. 704) in an RS-Residential Single Family District, was approved as advertised.

The foregoing resolution was offered by Commissioner Weaver, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner

Johnson, and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:


