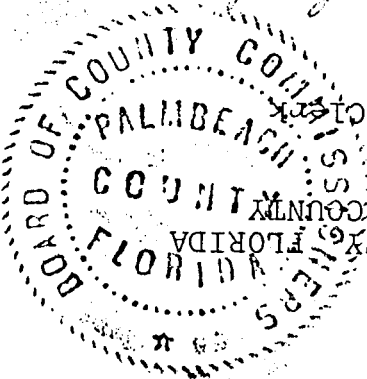
WHEREAS, Petition No. 75-63 was presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County at its public hearing conducted on 29 May 1975.

PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, by E.W. "Bud" Weaver, Chairman, for the REZONING, FROM CN-NEIGHBORHOOD COMMERCIAL DISTRICT TO RM-RESIDENTIAL MULTIPLE FAMILY DISTRICT (MEDIUM DENSITY) of the South 100 feet of Section 28, Township 46 South, Range 43 East, lying North of the East-West quarter section line, lying between the Easterly right-of-way of the Intracoastal Waterway and the Atlantic Ocean, less the right-of-way for State Road A-1-A. Said property located on the east and west sides of State Road A-1-A approximately 1/2 mile south of the intersection with the extension of Southwest 12th Street, was approved as advertised.
