RESOLUTION NO. R-2003-1130

RESOLUTION APPROVING ZONING PETITION CA1980-220A CLASS A CONDITIONAL USE PETITION OF SOLDIERS OF THE CROSS BY LAND RESEARCH MANAGEMENT, INC., AGENT (SOLDIERS OF THE CROSS)

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, as the governing body of Palm Beach County, Florida, pursuant to the authority vested in Chapter 163 and Chapter 125, Florida Statutes, is authorized and empowered to consider petitions relating to zoning; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, pursuant to Article 5 (Development Review Procedures) of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code (Ordinance 92-20, as amended) is authorized and empowered to consider, approve, approve with conditions or deny Class A Conditional Uses; and

WHEREAS, the notice and hearing requirements, as provided for in Article 5 of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code have been satisfied; and

WHEREAS, Zoning Petition CA1980-220A was presented to the Board of County Commissioners at a public hearing conducted on July 24, 2003; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has considered the evidence and testimony presented by the petitioner and other interested parties, the recommendations of the various county review agencies, and the recommendations of the Zoning Commission; and

WHEREAS, this approval is subject to Article 5, Section 5.8 (Compliance with Time Limitations) of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code (ULDC) and other provisions requiring that development commence in a timely manner; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has considered the findings in the staff report and the following findings of fact:

- 1. This Class A Conditional Use is consistent with the Palm Beach County Comprehensive Plan.
- 2. This Class A Conditional Use complies with relevant and appropriate portions of Article 6, Supplementary Use Standards of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code.
- This Class A Conditional Use is consistent with the requirements of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code.
- This Class A Conditional Use, with conditions as adopted, is compatible as defined in the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code and generally consistent with the uses and character of the land surrounding and in the vicinity of the land proposed for development.
- This Class A Conditional Use, with conditions as adopted, complies with standards imposed on it by all other applicable provisions of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code for use, layout, function, and general development characteristics.
- This Class A Conditional Use meets applicable local land development regulations.

- 7 This Class A Conditional Use, with conditions as adopted, minimizes adverse effects, including visual impact and intensity of the proposed use on adjacent lands.
- 8 This Class A Conditional Use has a concurrency determination and complies with Article 11, Adequate Public Facility Standards of the ULDC.
- This Class A Conditional Use, with conditions as adopted, minimizes environmental impacts, including but not limited to water, air, stormwater management, wildlife, vegetation, wetlands and the natural functioning of the environment.
- 10. This Class A Conditional Use, with conditions as adopted, will result in logical, timely and orderly development patterns.

WHEREAS, Article 5 of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code requires that the action of the Board of County Commissioners be adopted by resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that Zoning Petition CA1980-220A, the petition of Soldiers of the Cross, by Land Research Management, Inc., agent, for a Class A Conditional Use to allow a church or place of worship in the Residential Medium Density Zoning District, on a parcel of land legally described in EXHIBIT A, attached hereto and made a part hereof, and generally located as shown on a vicinity sketch as indicated in EXHIBIT B, attached hereto and made a part hereof, was approved on July 24, 2003, subject to the conditions of approval described in EXHIBIT C, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

VICINITY SKETCH



CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

A ALL PETITIONS

1. Development of the property is limited to the uses and site design approved by the Board of County Commissioners. The approved site plan is dated May 21, 2003. All modifications must be approved by the Board of County Commissioners unless the proposed changes are required to meet conditions of approval or are in accordance with the ULDC. (DRC: ZONING - Zoning)

B ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW

1. At time of submittal for final DRC approval of the site plan, the architectural elevations for all buildings shall be submitted simultaneously with the site plan for final architectural review and approval. The elevations and the site plan shall be designed to be consistent with Section 6.6.E. and Section 6.6.C of the ULDC. Development shall be consistent with the approved architectural elevations and DRC approved site plan. (DRC: ZONING - Zoning)

C ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES MANAGEMENT

1. All existing native vegetation, including understory, depicted on the site plan to remain shall be maintained in perpetuity. Areas where existing native vegetation have been incorporated into the site plan shall be maintained free from invasive, exotic and non-native species. (ONGOING: ERM - ERM)

D LANDSCAPING - STANDARD

- 1 Fifty-percent (50%) of trees to be planted in the perimeter buffer shall be native canopy trees and meet the following minimum standards at installation:
 - a tree height: Fourteen (14) feet;
 - b trunk diameter: 3.5 inches measured at 4.5 feet above grade;
 - c canopy diameter: Seven (7) feet diameter shall be determined by the average canopy radius measured at three (3) points from the trunk to the outermost branch tip. Each radius shall measure a minimum of 3.5 feet in length; and,
 - d credit may be given for existing or relocated trees provided they meet ULDC requirements. (CO: LANDSCAPE Zoning)
- All palms required to be planted on the property by this approval shall meet the following minimum standards at installation:
 - a palm heights: twelve (12) feet clear trunk;
 - b clusters: staggered heights twelve (12) to eighteen (18) feet; and,
 - c credit may be given for existing or relocated palms provided they meet current ULDC requirements. (CO: LANDSCAPE Zoning)
- All shrub or hedge materials shall be planted in continuous masses and in a meandering and naturalistic pattern, consisting of a minimum of two (2) to three (3) varying heights. Shrub materials shall be continuously maintained to achieve the following heights and hierarchical effect:

- a eighteen (18) to twenty-four (24) inches groundcover and small shrub;
- b twenty-four (24) to thirty-six (36) inches medium shrub;
- c. forty-eight (48) to seventy-two (72) inches large shrub; and,
- d this condition does not apply where a single row of hedge is required on one or both sides of a fence. (CO: LANDSCAPE Zoning)
- 4 All trees, palms and shrub/hedge material shall be planted in a meandering and naturalistic pattern. (CO: LANDSCAPE Zoning)
- A group of three (3) or more palm or pine trees may not supersede the requirement for a canopy tree in that location, unless specified herein. (CO: LANDSCAPE Zoning)
- All canopy trees to be planted within overhead utilities easement shall be consistent with FP&L's tree list suggested in the "Plant the Right Tree in the Right Place" guidelines and pursuant to Section 7.3.E.12.a of the ULDC. (CO: LANDSCAPE Zoning)
- Field adjustment of plant materials and berms may be permitted to provide pedestrian sidewalks/bike paths and to accommodate transverse utility and/or drainage easements crossings and/or existing vegetation. (CO: LANDSCAPE Zoning)
- Prior to final DRC approval of the site plan, an Alternative Landscape Plan shall be submitted for landscaping along the north and west property lines and any portion of the property where existing vegetation may affect the proposed landscaping. (DRC: LANDSCAPE Zoning)

E ENGINEERING

- Prior to issuance of a building permit the property owner shall convey a temporary roadway construction easement along Haverhill Road to Paim Beach County. Construction by the applicant within this easement shall conform to all Palm Beach County Standards and Codes. The location, legal sketches and the dedication documents shall be approved by the County Engineer prior to final acceptance. (BLDG PERMIT: MONITORING Eng)
- Prior to the issuance of the first Building Permit, the property owner shall convey to Palm Beach County Land Development Division by warranty deed for Flory Drive, an additional five (5) feet along the north property line of this parcel. Right of way conveyance shall be along the projects entire frontage and shall be free of all encumbrances and encroachments. Developer shall provide Palm Beach County with sufficient documentation acceptable to the Right of Way Acquisition Section to ensure that the property is free of all encumbrances and encroachments. Thoroughfare Plan Road right-of-way conveyances shall be consistent with Palm Beach County's Thoroughfare Right of Way Identification Map and shall include where appropriate as determined by the County Engineer provisions for Expanded Intersection Details and "Corner Clips." (BLDG PERMIT: MONITORING Eng)
 - 3. In order to comply with the mandatory Traffic Performance Standards, the Developer shall be restricted to the following phasing schedule:
 - a) No Building Permits for the site may be issued after January 1, 2006. A time extension for this condition may be approved by the County Engineer based upon an approved Traffic Study which complies with Mandatory Traffic Performance Standards in place at the time of the request. This extension request shall be made pursuant to the requirements of Section 5.8 of the Unified Land Development Code. (DATE: MONITORING Eng)

4. The concurrency approval is subject to the project aggregation rule set forth in the Traffic Performance Standards Ordinance. (DRC: ENG - Eng)

F <u>LANDSCAPING ALONG THE EAST PROPERTY LINE</u> (FRONTAGE OF HAVERHILL ROAD)

- 1. Landscaping and buffering along the east property line shall be upgraded to include:
 - a a minimum fifteen (15) foot wide landscape buffer strip. No width reduction or easement encroachment shall be permitted;
 - b a continuous two (2) foot high berm measured from top of curb;
 - c one (1) native canopy tree for each thirty (30) linear feet of the property line;
 - d one (1) palm or pine tree for each thirty (30) linear feet of the property line with a maximum spacing of sixty (60) feet between clusters; and,
 - e one (1) small shrub for each two (2) linear feet of the property line. Shrub shall be a minimum height of eighteen (18) inches at installation:
 - f one (1) medium shrub for each four (4) linear feet of the property line. Shrub shall be a minimum height of twenty-four (24) inches at installation; and,
 - g one (1) large shrub for each six (6) linear feet of the property line. Shrub shall be a minimum height of thirty (30) inches at installation. (CO: LANDSCAPE - Zoning)

G LANDSCAPING ALONG THE NORTH, SOUTH AND WEST PROPERTY LINES (ABUTTING FLORY DRIVE, RESIDENTIAL AND UNDEVELOPED PROPERTY)

- 1 Landscaping and buffering along the north, south and west property lines shall be upgraded to include:
 - a minimum fifteen (15) foot wide landscape buffer strip. No width reduction or easement encroachment shall be permitted;
 - b a six (6) foot high opaque wood fence;
 - c one (1) canopy tree planted for each twenty (20) linear feet of the property line, and shall be planted alternating on both sides of the fence;
 - d one (1) palm or pine tree for each thirty (30) linear feet of the property line with a maximum spacing of sixty (60) feet between clusters, and shall be planted alternating on both sides of the fence:
 - e one (1) small shrub for each two (2) linear feet of the property line. Shrub shall be a minimum height of twenty-four (24) inches at installation, and be planted on both sides of the fence; and,
 - one (1) medium shrub for each four (4) linear feet of the property line. Shrub shall be a minimum height of thirty-six (36) inches at installation, and be planted on both sides of the fence. (CO: LANDSCAPE Zoning)

H LANDSCAPING - INTERIOR

- 1. A minimum of one (1) landscape island shall be provided for every ten (10) parking spaces. The maximum spacing between landscape islands shall not exceed one hundred (100) linear feet. (DRC: ZONING Zoning)
- Foundation planting or grade level planters shall be provided along the facades of all structures as shown on the approved site plan dated May 21, 2003. (DRC / CO: ZONING / LANDSCAPE Zoning)
- 3 Landscaping for terminal islands in the parking area shall consist of the following:

- a one (1) canopy tree for each island; and,
- b a continuous hedge between all trees within the islands where applicable. Shrub or hedge materials or groundcover shall be maintained at a maximum height of thirty (30) inches. (CO: LANDSCAPE Zoning)

I. <u>LIGHTING</u>

- 1. All outdoor lighting used to illuminate the subject property and identification signs shall be of minimum necessary to satisfy the Palm Beach County Security Code, low intensity, shielded and directed down and away from adjacent properties and streets. (CO / ONGOING: BLDG / CODE ENF Zoning)
- All outdoor, freestanding lighting fixtures shall not exceed fifteen (15) feet in height measured from finished grade to highest point. (CO: BLDG -Zoning)
- All outdoor, freestanding lighting fixtures be setback a minimum of twenty (20) feet from the north, south and west property lines. (CO: BLDG Zoning)
- 4 All outdoor lighting shall be extinguished no later than 9:30 p.m. excluding security lighting only. (ONGOING: CODE ENF Zoning)
- The lighting conditions above shall not apply to proposed security or low voltage landscape/accent type lights used to emphasize plant material. (ONGOING: CODE ENF Zoning)

J SIGNS

- 1. Freestanding signs shall be limited as follows:
 - a maximum sign height, measured from finished grade to highest point six (6) feet;
 - b maximum sign face area per side fifty (50) square feet;
 - c maximum number of signs one (1);
 - d style monument style only; and,
 - e location within twenty (20) feet of the entrance.
 - f. Signs shall be limited to identification of tenants and hours of service only. (CO: BLDG Zoning)

K USE LIMITATION

- All services shall be held within the church and the hours of operation shall be limited to 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. excluding holiday services. (ONGOING: CODE ENF Zoning)
- Accessory outdoor uses such as temporary sales events shall be limited to a maximum of four (4) events per year and shall be setback a minimum of thirty (30) feet from all perimeter property lines. No temporary amusements or special events are permitted on the property. (ONGOING / SPECIAL PERMIT: CODE ENF Zoning)
- No outdoor or amplified music shall be audible from the property lines (ONGOING: CODE ENF Zoning)
- The retreat shall be limited to a maximum of six (6) beds at any given time, and use Thursday through Sunday only. (ONGOING: CODE ENF Zoning)
- No alcohol, drug or similar treatment or counseling shall be permitted on the property. (ONGOING: CODE ENF Zoning)

L. COMPLIANCE

- In granting this approval, the Board of County Commissioners relied upon the oral and written representations of the petitioner both on the record and as part of the application process. Deviations from or violation of these representations shall cause the approval to be presented to the Board of County Commissioners for review under the compliance condition of this approval. (ONGOING: MONITORING - Zoning)
- 2. Failure to comply with any of the conditions of approval for the subject property at any time may result in:
 - a The issuance of a stop work order; the issuance of a cease and desist order; the denial or revocation of a building permit; the denial or revocation of a Certificate of Occupancy; the denial of any other permit, license or approval to any developer, owner, lessee, or user of the subject property; the revocation of any other permit, license or approval from any developer, owner, lessee, or user of the subject property; revocation of any concurrency; and/or
 - b The revocation of the Official Map Amendment, Conditional Use, Requested Use, Development Order Amendment, and/or any other zoning approval; and/or
 - c. A requirement of the development to conform with the standards of the ULDC at the time of the finding of non-compliance, or the addition or modification of conditions reasonably related to the failure to comply with existing conditions; and/or
 - d Referral to code enforcement; and/or
 - e Imposition of entitlement density or intensity.

Staff may be directed by the Executive Director of PZ&B or a Code Enforcement Special Master to schedule a Status Report before the body which approved the Official Zoning Map Amendment, Conditional Use, Requested Use, Development Order Amendment, and/or other zoning approval, in accordance with the provisions of Section 5.8 of the ULDC, in response to any flagrant violation and/or continued violation of any condition of approval.

Appeals of any departmental administrative actions hereunder may be taken to the Palm Beach County Board of Adjustment or as otherwise provided in the Unified Land Development Code (ULDC), as amended. Appeals of any revocation of an Official Zoning Map Amendment, Conditional Use, Requested Use, Development Order Amendment or other actions based on a Board of County Commission decision shall be by petition for writ of certiorari to the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit. (ONGOING: MONITORING - Zoning)
