RESOLUTION APPROVING ZONING PETITION Z2003-091 OFFICIAL ZONING MAP AMENDMENT (REZONING) PETITION OF JOHN RAWN BY RICHARD CARLSON, ESQ., AGENT (WILSON ROAD REZONING)

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, as the governing body of Palm Beach County, Florida, pursuant to the authority vested in Chapter 163 and Chapter 125, Florida Statutes, is authorized and empowered to consider petitions relating to zoning; and

WHEREAS, the notice and public hearing requirements, as provided for in Article 5 (Development Review Procedures) of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code (Ordinance 92-20, as amended), have been satisfied; and

WHEREAS, Zoning Petition Z2003-091 was presented to the Board of County Commissioners at a public hearing conducted on March 25, 2004; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has considered the evidence and testimony presented by the petitioner and other interested parties, the recommendations of the various county review agencies, and the recommendation of the Zoning Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has considered the findings in the staff report and the following findings of fact:

- 1. This official zoning map amendment (rezoning) is consistent with the Palm Beach County Comprehensive Plan;
- 2. This official zoning map amendment (rezoning) is consistent with the requirements of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code;
- 3. This official zoning map amendment (rezoning) is compatible with surrounding uses and zones, as defined in the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code, is generally consistent with existing uses and zones surrounding the subject land, and is the appropriate zoning district for the land;
- 4. This official zoning map amendment (rezoning) does not result in significantly adverse impacts on the natural environment, including but not limited to water, air, stormwater management, wildlife, vegetation, wetlands, and the natural functioning of the environment;
- 5. This official zoning map amendment (rezoning) will result in a logical and orderly development pattern;
- 6. This official zoning map amendment (rezoning) complies with Article 11 (Adequate Public Facilities Standards) of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code; and,
- 7. This official zoning map amendment (rezoning) is consistent with the requirements of all other applicable local land development regulations.

WHEREAS, Article 5, Section 5.3.D.9 (Action by Board of County Commissioners) of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code requires that the action of the Board of County Commissioners be adopted by resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that Zoning Petition Z2003-091, the petition of John Rawn, by Richard Carlson, agent, for an OFFICIAL ZONING MAP AMENDMENT (REZONING) from the Agricultural Residential Zoning District to the Residential Transitional Zoning District on a parcel of land legally described in EXHIBIT A, attached hereto and made a part hereof, and generally located as indicated on a vicinity sketch attached as EXHIBIT B, attached hereto and made a part hereof, was approved on March 25, 2004 subject to the voluntary commitments described in EXHIBIT C, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

VICINITY SKETCH (Zoning Quad Map 32)




EXHIBIT C

VOLUNTARY COMMITMENTS

A. <u>HEALTH</u>

- 1. Prior to the issuance of a building permit, an application and engineering plans shall be submitted to the Palm Beach County Health Department to construct an onsite sewage treatment and disposal system (OSTDS) in accordance with Rule 64E-6 FAC and Palm Beach County ECR-I. (BLDG PERMIT: HEALTH Health)
- 2. Prior to the issuance of a building permit, an application and engineering plans shall be submitted to the Palm Beach County Health Department to construct or upgrade the existing well to a non-community well in accordance with Rule 62-555 FAC and Palm Beach County ECR-II. (BLDG PERMIT: HEALTH Health)

There is no Voluntary Commitments B, C, or D for this request.

E. **ENGINEERING**

 Prior to issuance of a Building Permit, the property owner shall plat the subject property in accordance with provisions of Article 11 of the Unified Land Development Code. (BLDG PERMIT: MONITORING-Eng)

F. <u>COMPLIANCE</u>

- In granting this approval, the Board of County Commissioners relied upon the oral and written representations of the petitioner both on the record and as part of the application process. Deviations from or violation of these representations shall cause the approval to be presented to the Board of County Commissioners for review under the compliance condition of this approval. (ONGOING: MONITORING - Zoning)
- 2. Failure to comply with any of the voluntary commitments for the subject property at any time may result in:
 - a. The issuance of a stop work order; the issuance of a cease and desist order; the denial or revocation of a building permit; the denial or revocation of a Certificate of Occupancy; the denial of any other permit, license or approval to any developer, owner, lessee, or user of the subject property; the revocation of any other permit, license or approval from any developer, owner, lessee, or user of the subject property; revocation of any concurrency; and/or
 - The revocation of the Official Map Amendment, zoning approval; and/or
 - c. A requirement of the development to conform with the standards of the ULDC at the time of the finding of non-compliance, or the addition or modification of conditions reasonably related to the failure to comply with existing conditions; and/or
 - d. Referral to code enforcement; and/or
 - e. Imposition of entitlement density or intensity.

Staff may be directed by the Executive Director of PZ&B or a Code Enforcement Special Master to schedule a Status Report before the body which approved the Official Zoning Map Amendment, and/or other zoning approval, in accordance with the provisions of Article 2.E of the ULDC, in response to any flagrant violation and/or continued violation of any condition of approval.

Appeals of any departmental administrative actions hereunder may be taken to the Palm Beach County Board of Adjustment or as otherwise provided in the Unified Land Development Code (ULDC), as amended. Appeals of any revocation of an Official Zoning Map Amendment, Conditional Use, Requested Use, Development Order Amendment or other actions based on a Board of County Commission decision shall be by petition for writ of certiorari to the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit. (ONGOING: MONITORING - Zoning)
