Description:

This presentation is an intermediate level presentation to help clinicians learn ways to facilitate healthy co-parenting with challenging relational dynamics. The presenter will identify the components and effects of poor co-parenting on children of varying ages and gender, as well as highlight protective factors to decrease child maladjustment. Furthermore, the presenter will provide clinical principles, interventions, and treatments pertaining to working with parents who are no longer in relationships, especially divorced couples. Case examples will be discussed to highlight appropriate implementation.

Gabriella Hill, Psy.D. is a post-doctoral fellow, who obtained both her Master's Degree and Doctorate Degree in Clinical Psychology from Regent University. Dr. Hill is also in the process of working toward certification as a PCIT Therapist.
