What is Public Charge?

“A test that looks at whether the person is likely to use certain government services in the future. In making this determination, immigration officials review all of a person’s circumstances, including their age, income, health, education or skills, and their sponsor’s affidavit of support or contract. They can also consider whether a person has used certain public programs.”
