Pool Barrier Requirements/Process

PPM# PB-O-104

All pools/spas shall be primary permits. Sub-permit applications may be accepted concurrently with the pool permit application. Pool sub-permits may be issued anytime (except for decks, which must be simultaneous) after the pool primary permit has been issued.

All permitted pools/spas are issued as a "primary" permit with sub-permits for a barrier, electric, and any other appropriate sub-trade. If a fence or wall exists, an inspection to determine code compliance will be performed prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Completion for the pool, spa or hot tub. A natural barrier may be utilized as a required pool barrier, provided it meets the requirements of the Florida Building Code.

The following Building Division forms are required to be submitted prior to permit completion, as appropriate:

- Affidavit of Understanding (click here for form) This form shall be signed by both the property owner and contractor indicating they understand that a 360-degree barrier is required around a pool, spa or hot tub and must be submitted with the application for the pool.
- 2. Pool Barrier Agreement (click here for form) This form shall be signed by the property owner and recorded in the Official Records of Palm Beach County in order to allow a neighbor's wall or fence to be utilized as part of the required barrier around a pool, spa or hot tub. The recorded Agreement must be submitted with the application for the pool.
