RE: 2004 Evaluation and Appraisal Report (EAR) for the Palm Beach County Comprehensive Plan

Dear Mr. Eubanks:

At the October 19, 2004 Public Hearing, the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners adopted the 2004 EAR for the Palm Beach County Comprehensive Plan. Attached is the Board's resolution adopting the County's EAR with the correspondent proof of publication.

In accordance with the provisions of 163.3191(6) three copies of the adopted 2004 EAR are provided for your review. These copies include one hard copy of the EAR and two copies on CD-ROM.

Development of Palm Beach County's EAR was initiated in the spring of 2003 and has included an extensive public participation process. Numerous workshops and public hearings were held, including advertised public hearings before the Land Use Advisory Board and the Board of County Commissioners.

The major issues were defined through a "scoping" process in meetings with review agency staff, informal and formal scooping meetings and two public workshops of the Land Use Advisory Board and the Board of County Commissioners. Participants included a broad range of public and private organizations, other local governments, civic and non-profit groups, and advocacy and special interest groups. Letters and public comments received during the entire process are contained in Chapter 5 of the EAR document.

The following interrelated major issues are analyzed in the 2004 EAR:

- 1) Ability of the Managed Growth Tier System and Future Land Uses to Accommodate Future Population and Development Activities;
- 2) Effectiveness of the County's Infill Development and Redevelopment Initiatives and Comprehensive Plan Policies;

- 3) Impacts of Development Trends and Policies in the Plan and on the Availability of Housing Options for Moderate, Low and Very Low Income Families and the County's Workforce;
- 4) Impacts of Development on Natural Resources, Agricultural Land and Rural Areas;
- 5) Assessment of Transportation Planning Programs and Comprehensive Plan Policies to Address the Impacts of Urban Growth; and
- 6) Improvement of Intergovernmental Coordination Between the County and Other Local Governments and Governmental Entities.

The EAR document suggests changes or amendments and actions that are needed to update the comprehensive plan and to respond to changed conditions or trends in the County. The EAR's most salient recommendations include:

- To continue implementing the Tier system with adjustments to address the impacts of Scripps and changes in circumstances in other parts of the County;
- To implement the proposed Urban Redevelopment Area, with increased densities and intensities, incentives and code adjustments to entice infill and redevelopment projects;
- To provide creative incentives to make it easier for private investors to build affordable and workforce housing developments;
- To plan for a concerted public/private effort at the regional level to address affordable housing issues;
- To perform a regional assessment of the Everglades Agricultural Area (EAA);
- To encourage land use patterns that shorten or eliminate automobile trips; and
- To support Transit Oriented Developments, where feasible.

In addition to the analysis of major issues, the EAR addresses the County's progress in achieving the Plan objectives as they relate to the issues; provides an assessment of the successes and shortcomings of the Plan; identifies improvements to the Plan to address these issues; reviews compliance with changes in state, regional and local policies on planning and growth management, changing conditions and trends; and addresses the four additional

special topics required by the state including: school concurrency and planning, impacts on coastal high hazard areas, 20-Year water supply work plan, and the short-term and long-term financial feasibility of the Plan.

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## I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends a motion to adopt: a resolution adopting the Evaluation and Appraisal Report (EAR) for the 1989 Palm Beach County Comprehensive Plan; and providing an effective date.

Summary: The EAR document suggests changes or amendments that are needed to update the comprehensive plan and to respond to changed conditions or trends in the County. The EAR's main recommendations include: to continue implementing the Tier system with adjustments to address the impacts of Scripps and changes in circumstances in other parts of the County; to implement the proposed Urban Redevelopment Area, with increased densities and intensities, incentives and code adjustments to entice infill and redevelopment projects; to provide creative incentives to make easier for private investors to build affordable and workforce housing developments; to plan for a concerted public/private effort at the regional level to address affordable housing issues; to reaffirm the County's desire to maintain agricultural production in the EAA and to continue protecting this area from encroachment by urban uses; to encourage land use patterns that shorten or eliminate automobile trips; and to support Transit Oriented Developments, where feasible. (Countywide, BB)

Background and Policy Issues: The State of Florida's local government comprehensive planning law, Chapter 163, Part 2, Florida Statutes (F.S.), requires that all counties and municipalities throughout Florida maintain long-range comprehensive planning programs, and that comprehensive planning should be a continuous and ongoing process. As a part of this process, local governments are required to periodically prepare an Evaluation and Appraisal Report (EAR) addressing implementation of the comprehensive plan. The Evaluation and Appraisal Report (EAR) is a Statemandated assessment of the comprehensive plan requiring adoption by the BCC. The BCC reviewed, discussed and provided input to the EAR report at the EAR Workshop conducted in August 24, 2004. The document recommended for BCC adoption and shown as Attachment No. 2 to this agenda item incorporates all the input provided to staff by the BCC at the EAR Workshop of August 24. 

The purpose of the EAR is to conduct an audit of the comprehensive planning process and to evaluate and assess the effectiveness, successes and failures of the County's adopted comprehensive plan and it's suitability for the next planning period. Consequently, the EAR document recommended for adoption by the BCC today suggests changes or amendments that are needed to update the comprehensive plan and to respond to changed conditions or trends in the County. The corrective actions identified in the EAR will be carried out through subsequent plan amendments and other means, in the 12 months following EAR adoption. Numerous public and private meetings were held and provided ample opportunity for public input on the EAR. Participants included a broad range of individuals representing government agencies, the private sector and a variety of interest groups. In addition, staff conducted two LUAB workshops and two BCC workshops on the EAR during the last year, where board members provided comments and input to the EAR report.

PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 163.3191, F.S., LOCAL GOVERNMENTS ARE REQUIRED TO PERIODICALLY PREPARE AN EVALUATION AND APPRAISAL REPORT (EAR), ADDRESSING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN. THE EAR IS INTENDED TO SERVE AS A SUMMARY AUDIT OF GROWTH MANAGEMENT DECISIONS THAT A LOCAL GOVERNMENT HAS UNDERTAKEN, AND IDENTIFY CHANGES THAT MAY BE NEEDED TO ADDRESS THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT'S NEEDS FOR THE NEXT PLANNING HORIZON. THE REPORT IS BASED ON THE COUNTY'S ANALYSIS OF MAJOR ISSUES TO FURTHER COMMUNITY GOALS CONSISTENT WITH STATEWIDE MINIMUM STANDARDS. ADDITIONALLY, THE EAR EVALUATES AND ASSESSES THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN IN ACCOMPLISHING ITS ADOPTED OBJECTIVES AS THEY RELATE TO THE ISSUES, AND INCLUDES SUGGESTED MODIFICATIONS OR AMENDMENTS THAT MAY BE NEEDED TO UPDATE THE PLAN AND ITS ELEMENTS INCLUDING REFORMULATED OBJECTIVES, POLICIES AND STANDARDS. LOCAL GOVERNMENTS ARE ALSO REQUIRED TO ADDRESS, AS PART OF THE EAR, SCHOOL PLANNING, IMPACTS TO COASTAL HIGH HAZARD AREAS (CHHA), LAND USE AND WATER SUPPLY PLANNING, AND THE FINANCIAL FEASIBILITY OF THE PLAN.
