Leonard Devine Jr. Plan Review

- Reviewed Minutes of December meeting
- Mr. Buscemi provided handouts and reviewed highlights for each of the following:
  - 1. White paper on outdoor lighting code issue as prepared by the National **Electrical Manufacturers Association**
  - 2. Outdoor lighting and road glare ordinance, Cherokee County, Georgia
  - 3. Ordinance on parking lot illumination, Miami Dade
  - 4. Model outdoor lighting ordinance for cities and towns
  - 5. Framework for outdoor lighting improvement ordinance as prepared by the Indiana Council on outdoor lighting
  - 6. Lighting ordinance, Brevard County
- Mr. Buscemi presented fourteen slides of good and bad examples of night lighting for the following uses:
  - a. Car dealership
  - b. Gas station
  - c. Supermarket center
- Mr. Youngross presented highlights of other lighting ordinances within Palm Beach County Municipalities and neighboring counties
- Mr. Youngross also presented ten examples of lighting photometric drawings (five good examples and five bad examples)
- Items discussed by Committee:
  - 1. Uniformity ratios (example Walgreens) 12:1 maximum to minimum 3:1 average minimum
- Publix increased their requirements from three floor candle to five floor candle at entrance areas
- Light sources:

HPS – High pressure sodium

MH - Metal halide

MV – Metal vapor

LPS - Low pressure sodium

HPS - Hard to differentiate colors

- Height of poles
   Location of poles and how light performs when integrated into landscape/tree areas
- Hours of operation
- Glare on R-O-W
- Security minimum levels within parking areas:
  - 1.5 minimum
  - 0.5 maximum foot candles six feet above grade at property line
- Light Pollution
- Effect of lighting ordinance on new and existing projects. Applicability for existing uses would be:
  - a) Hours of operation
  - b) Minimum security lighting
  - c) Glare on R-O-W
- Mr. Buscemi stated that the requirements should be tier sensitive and categorized by use.
- Mr. Devine Jr. suggested using the following as a good example: Ordinance 1046 <a href="https://www.cfas.org/casselberry.htm">www.cfas.org/casselberry.htm</a>
- Mr. Buscemi will have staff prepare draft Lighting Ordinance and will transmit to all prior to the next meeting which is scheduled for February 16, 2005 at 3:00PM.
