

Youth Empowerment Center (YEC)

Summary Report 2016-2017

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The City of Belle Glade Youth Empowerment Center (YEC) provides youth with quality and affordable educational, recreational, and familly support services that foster positive physical, social, emotional, cognitive growth, and development. The goal of YEC is to support youth to succeed in school and to contribute to their positive personal development by offering a variety of activities that suit their needs. Participants at YEC range from 11 to 18 years of age and over the fiscal year 2016-2017, YEC served a total of 83 youth of which 61 were males and 22 were females.

The YEC provides programming, services, and activities year round. The YEC operates Monday through Friday from 3:00 - 7:00 pm during regular school days, school holidays and throughout the summer from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm.



Promoting Education

At the Youth Empowerment Center education is a key component. We encourage and support the youth to excel academically, on of our biggest motivation for the youth is the annual College Tour Experience. During spring break the City of Belle Glade and the City of Rivera Beach YEC's partnered together for the Multi-State, six day, 2017 College Tour Experience. Eighteen Students had the opportunity to visit the following six historically black colleges and universities: Alabama Agricultural and Mechanical University, Fisk University, Tennessee State University, West Virgina State University, University of the District of Colombia and Howard University. The youth were given a tour of the campuses, met with advisors and financial aid counselors and experienced the full college life.


